25 26 27 28 29	WHEREAS, a statewide approach to regulate the sale and possession of this substance, which presents a public health risk, is the next logical step; and WHEREAS, several states across the country have banned the sale and possession synthetic cannabinoid, including Kansas, Kentucky, Alabama, Michigan, Missouri, and Tennessee; and		
30 31 32	WHEREAS, others states, such as Illinois, Louisiana, New Jersey and New York are currently considering enacting state-wide bans of the sale and possession of synthetic cannabinoids.
