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**Resolution # 100-2010 REZONE PETITION #6-2010** 

Ordinance Amendment offered by Supervisors of the Planning and Zoning Committee.

Resolved by the Board of Supervisors of Oneida County, Wisconsin:

WHEREAS, the Planning & Zoning Committee, having considered Petition #6-2010, (copy attached) which was filed July 27, 2010, to amend the Master Zoning District Document and the Oneida County Official Zoning District Boundary Map, and having given notice thereof as provided by law and having held a public hearing thereon September 15, 2010 pursuant to Section 59.69(5). Wisconsin Statutes, and having been informed of the facts pertinent to the changes which are as follows:

To rezone land from District #1A Forestry and District #2, Single Family Residential to all District #4 Residential Farming on property described as:

- A. SE NW, Section 34, T37N, R9E, PL 658, Town of Pine Lake.
- B. SW NE, Section 34, T37N, R9E, PL 653, Town of Pine Lake.
- C. SE NE, Section 34, T37N, R9E, PL 654, Town of Pine Lake.
- D. All that part of NW SW lying north of Oak Leaf Road Section 35, T37N, R9E, PL 676-2, Town of Pine Lake.

And being duly advised of the wishes of the people in the area affected as follows:

The petitioner requested the change to give their land a more consistent zoning district classification and allow the petitioner the ability to pursue a Conditional Use Permit for additional improvements and a possible expansion of the Club's activities.

The Town of Pine Lake approved the request (a copy of approval letter attached). A Pine Lake Town Board Supervisor appeared at the public hearing and stated the Town Board continues to support these changes.

Adjoining landowners were provided with a written notice of the change and several supported the request one letter of objection was received. The Planning & Zoning Committee has reviewed the general standards as specified in Section 9.86F of the Oneida County Zoning & Shoreland Protection Ordinance and concluded that the standards have been met. The Planning & Zoning Committee recommends passage.

## NOW THEREFORE. THE ONEIDA COUNTY BOARD OF SUPERVISORS DOES **ORDAIN AS FOLLOWS:** Petition #6-2010:
