6	Whereas, Chapter 16, titled "Road Naming and Uniform Addressing System"				
7	was reviewed by the Land Records Committee and the Committee recommends that				
8	changes be made to various parts of the ordinance for improved administration of the				
9	ordinance.				
10	NOW, THEREFORE, THE ONEIDA COUNTY BOARD OF SUPERVISORS				
11	DOES ORDAIN AS FOLLOWS:				
12	Section 1. Any existing ordinances, codes, resolutions, or portions thereof in				
13 14	conflict with this ordinance shall be and hereby are repealed as far as any conflict exists.				
14	Section 2. This ordinance shall take effect the day after passage and publication as required by law.				
16	Section 3. If any claims, provisions or portions of this ordinance are adjudged				
17	unconstitutional or invalid by a court of competent jurisdiction, the				
18	remainder of this ordinance shall not be affected thereby.				
19	Section 4. The following Sections of Chapter 16 of the General Code of Oneida				
20	County, Wisconsin, is amended as follows [additions noted by underline, deletions noted				
21	by strikethrough]:

23	16.02 JURISDICTION.				
23 24 25	The County shall be the lead coordinator in administering this chapter. The				
25	Towns shall cooperate with the County in the implementation of this system. The				
26	Land Information <u>Director Manager</u> , who shall work under the direction of the				
27	Land Records Committee, shall implement the system defined below.

29	16.03 ASSIGNMENT OF ROAD NAMES.				
30	(1) All public roads shall be named.				
31	(2) All new private roads or easements serving more than $2 \frac{4}{4}$ residences or				
32	lots shall be named.				
33	(3) Existing public or private roads serving more than $2 \frac{4}{4}$ residences or lots				
34	are encouraged to be named if the County determines it is necessary to better				
35	locate properties or it is needed to allow for proper implementation of the				
36 37	addressing system. If they remain unnamed, the residences or lots must be signed as described in the "Address Signage" section of this chapter [§16.07].				
38	(6) Landowners and easement holder(s) of record of a new or existing				
38 39	private road shall submit a proposed road name to the Town that has been				
40	agreed upon by the majority of the landowners and easement holder(s) of record.				
41	Renaming of an existing private road shall also be by the majority stated above.				
42	The Town shall act on the road name and submit it to the County for approval. If				
43	the landowners and easement holder(s) do not submit a name, the Town may act				
44	on behalf of the landowners.				
45	The County shall facilitate the process of naming of roads with the				
46	landowners, easement holders and the Town. The County shall have the final				
47	approval authority of the road name.				
48	(13) The assignment of addresses or road names to private roads in no way				
49	obligates the Town or County to maintain said private road or indicates				
50	the private road is suitable for access by emergency vehicles.
