20 21 22 23 24	WHEREAS, the purpose of the ordinance amendment is to adopt the Dam Failure Analysis to prohibit development in the Flood Shadow if there is a dam failure; and
24 25 26 27	WHEREAS, The Planning and Development Committee held a public hearing and no one appeared for or against the ordinance amendment; and
28 29 30	WHEREAS, the Planning and Development committee has carefully studied the proposed changes and recommends approval.
31 32	NOW, THEREFORE, THE ONEIDA COUNTY BOARD OF SUPERVISORS DOES ORDAIN AS FOLLOWS:
33 34 35 36	Section 1. Any existing ordinances, codes, resolutions, or portions thereof in conflict with this ordinance shall be and hereby are repealed as far as any conflict exists. Section 2. This ordinance shall take effect the day after passage and publication as required by law.

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53	(1)	AREAS TO BE REGULATED
54		This ordinance regulates all areas that would be covered by the regional
55		flood or base flood-as shown on the Flood Insurance Rate Map (FIRM) or
56		other maps approved by DNR.
57		Base flood elevations are derived from the flood profiles in the Flood
58		Insurance Study- (FIS) and are shown as AE, A1-30, and AH Zones on the

		FIRM. Other regulatory zones are displayed as A and AO zones. Regional
60		Flood Elevations (RFE) may be derived from other studies. If more than
61		one map or revision is referenced, the most restrictive information shall
62		apply.

64	(2)	<u>OFFICIAL MAPS & REVISIONS</u>
65		The boundaries of all floodplain districts are designated as A, AE, AH, AO or
66		A1-30 on the maps based on the Flood Insurance Study (FIS) listed below.
67		Any change to the base flood elevations (BFE) or any changes to the
68		boundaries of the floodplain or floodway in the FIS or on the Flood
69		Insurance Rate Map (FIRM) must be reviewed and approved by the DNR
70		and FEMA through the Letter of Map Change process (see s.8.0
70		<i>Amendments</i>) before it is effective. No changes to RFE's on non-FEMA
72		
		maps shall be effective until approved by the DNR. These maps and
73		revisions are on file in the office of the Planning & Zoning Department,
74		Oneida County. If more than one map or revision is referenced, the most
75		restrictive information shall apply.
