38 39	(2)	The inventory list shall be circulated to the various departments of the County and requests for use of specific items of personal property appearing on the list			
40		may be submitted to the Public Safety Committee for review and approval as			
41		being in the best interests of the County. An inventory of such property shall be			
42		maintained and updated on an annual basis for so long as such property is			
43		utilized by any of the various County departments. The name of the department,			
44		the person in such department who is responsible for the property, the
