5	ORDINANCE AMENDMENT #
6	Ordinance Amendment offered by Supervisors of the Forestry, Land, & Outdoor
7	Recreation Committee.
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9	Whereas, over of course of the past 2-years, the Forestry, Land, and Outdoor
10	Recreation Department has made numerous changes and improvements to Perch Lake
11	Park and the surrounding silent sports trails located in the Cassian-Woodboro Block of
12	the Oneida County Forest; and
13	Whereas, the Forestry, Land, and Outdoor Recreation Committee and
14	Department have recognized that the management of Perch Lake Park and the
15	surrounding trail network requires the establishment of specialized regulations to
16	address public use of this unique facility and the surrounding trails; and
17	Whereas, the Forestry, Land, and Outdoor Recreation Department, has
18 19	developed a comprehensive list of regulations and administrative policies for the
20	management of recreation facilities, and Whereas, the Forestry, Land, and Outdoor Recreation Committee has reviewed
21	the proposed Ordinance Amendment and have determined that Sections 14.10, 14.13,
22	and 25.04 of the Oneida County General Code should be amended to include said
23	regulations and administrative policies.
24	NOW, THEREFORE, THE ONEIDA COUNTY BOARD OF SUPERVISORS
25	DOES ORDAIN AS FOLLOWS:
26	Section 1. Any existing ordinances, codes, resolutions, or portions thereof in
27	conflict with this ordinance shall be and hereby are repealed as far as any conflict exists.
28	Section 2. This ordinance shall take effect the day after passage and publication
29	as required by law.
30	Section 3. If any claims, provisions or portions of this ordinance are adjudged
31	unconstitutional or invalid by a court of competent jurisdiction, the
32	remainder of this ordinance shall not be affected thereby.
33	Section 4. Sections 14.10, 14.13, and 25.04 of the General Code of Oneida
34	County, Wisconsin, is amended as follows [additions noted by underline, deletions noted
35 36	by strikethrough]:
37	14.10 <u>DEFINITIONS</u> .
38	Unless the context specifically indicated otherwise, the meaning of the terms used in this
39	subchapter shall be as follows:
40	(1) RECREATION AREAS. (Am. #107-2005; #53-2008) All lands and water heretofore
41	and hereafter acquired by the County or placed under the jurisdiction of the Committee
42	and designated by signage or, as a matter of record, as a distinct unit for special
43	recreational functions to include swimming areas, picnicking areas, fishing areas, nature
44	study areas, campgrounds and general recreation areas. The following are designated
45	as County recreation areas:
46	(a) Almon Park Recreation Area.
47	(b) Town Line <u>Townline Park</u> Recreation Area .
48	(c) Perch Lake Park Picnic Area.
49 50	(d) Bass Lake Picnic Area. Enterprise Forest Campground.
50 51	(e) Willow Rapids Picnic Area. (f) Enterprise Forest Campground.
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- 52 (2) BOAT LANDING AND PUBLIC ACCESS AREAS. All lands and water heretofore and
- hereafter acquired by the County or placed under the jurisdiction of the Committee which
- are signed and developed for water access purposes. The following areas are
- 55 designated as County boat landings:
- 56 Sections (a) through (f) remain unchanged.
- 57 (g) Townline Park Boat Landing.
- 58 Sections (3) remains unchanged.
- 59 (4) NON-MOTORIZED SILENT SPORTS TRAIL FACILITIES. (Am. #107-2005) All lands
- 60 heretofore and hereafter acquired by the County and developed into non-motorized trail
- systems which are signed, groomed, or otherwise maintained for any of the following
- 62 activities: hiking, biking, snow-shoeing, or cross country skiing. Those designated non-
- 63 motorized silent sports trail facilities are listed as follows:
- 64 Sections (a) remains unchanged.
- 65 (b) Washburn Non-Motorized Silent Sports Trails Network.
- 66 Sections (c) and (d) remain unchanged.
- 67 (e) Almon Park Trails (for winter snow-shoeing snowshoeing).
- 68 Sections 1. remains unchanged.
- 69 2. Upland Trail.

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- 70 (5) Pet. means a domesticated dog or cat.
- 71 (6) <u>Silent Sports Trails</u>. trails formally designated and maintained for any of the following activities: hiking, biking, skiing, or snowshoeing.

14.13 RULES AND REGULATIONS. (Am. #53-2008)

- (1) CLOSING HOURS. (Am. #53-2008) No person shall enter or be in any County
- recreation area between the hours of sunset and the following sunrise 10:00PM and
- 77 <u>6:00AM.</u> All County recreation areas, waysides, boat landings and special use areas,
- 78 shall only be considered day use facilities, and no No overnight camping shall be
- allowed at any County recreation area, boat landing, or special use area. County
- 80 campgrounds are exempt from closing hour regulations. Regulations pertaining to
- designated campground use are listed in section 14.18 of this code. Persons
- 82 transporting watercraft to and from designated boat landings are permitted at any hour.
- 83 (2) RECREATION AREA INFRASTRUCTURE MAINTENANCE SCHEDULE CLOSING
- 84 DATES. Picnic areas and other recreation area facilities are not plowed for vehicle traffic
- 85 during the winter months. All County recreation areas are open year-round for public
- 86 use. However, infrastructure of some County recreation areas are only seasonally
- 87 <u>maintained, resulting in access roads, parking lots, and toilet buildings to be un-plowed.</u>
- gated, or locked during specific dates. The infrastructure maintenance schedule for
- 89 County Recreation Areas are is follows:
- 90 (a) Almon Park:
- 91 <u>1. Toilet buildings are seasonally maintained and remain open for public use between</u>
- 92 the dates of May 15th and October 31st.
- 93 2. Access road and parking lots are seasonally maintained and open to public use
- between the dates of May 15th and November 15th.
- 95 (b) Townline Park:
- 96 <u>1. Toilet buildings are seasonally maintained and remain open for public use between</u>
- 97 the dates of May 15th and October 31st.
- 98 2. Access road and parking lots are seasonally maintained and open to public use
- between the dates of April 30th and November 15th.
- 100 (c) Perch Lake Park: All park infrastructure is open and maintained year-round for public
- 101 use.
- 102 (d) Enterprise Forest Campground: All campground infrastructure is seasonally

- maintained and open to public use between the dates of May 22nd and December 2nd. 103
- 104 Sections (3) through (5) remain unchanged.
- 105 (6) DESTRUCTION, DEFACEMENT OR REMOVAL. Except for the picking of edible
- 106 fruits or nuts for noncommercial purposes, the following are prohibited:
- 107 Sections (a) through (c) remain unchanged.
- 108 (d) Removing, injuring damaging or defacing in any manner any structures including
- 109 buildings, signs, fences, tables, or other County property.
- 110 Sections (7) and (8) remain unchanged.
- (9) DISPOSAL OF REFUSE. No person shall dispose of any litter, garbage, sewage, 111
- 112 bottles, tin cans, cigarette butts, paper or any other waste material by dumping such
- 113 refuse in any County recreation area, forest land, boat landing, or special use area, or
- 114 forest land, except by placing it said refuse in receptacles provided for such purposes.
- 115 Charcoal residue in any grill, fire-ring, or fireplace shall be left in its place of origin a
- grate or fireplace until completely extinguished and cool cold. 116
- 117 (10) GLASS PROHIBITED. (Am. #53-2008) No glass containers are allowed in any
- 118 County recreation areas except in designated campgrounds.
- 119 (11) VEHICLES AND BOAT RESTRICTIONS.
- 120 Sections (a) remains unchanged.
- 121 (b) Reckless driving prohibited. No person shall operate any vehicle in any park in a
- 122 reckless manner or contrary to §346.62, Wis. Stats, in any Recreation Area.
- 123 Sections (c) remains unchanged.
- 124 (d) Use of motor boats restricted. By order of the Town Board of the Town of Pelican, no
- 125 person shall operate any motor-driven boat in waters of Buck Lake; nor shall any person
- 126 operate any motordriven motor-driven boat in waters of Perch Lake by order of the Town
- 127 Board of the Town of Woodboro.
- 128 (e) Parking restricted. No person shall park, stop or leave standing, whether attended or
- 129 unattended, any vehicle, obstruction, or watercraft:
- 130 1. Blocking, obstructing, or limiting the use of any road, trail, gate, parking lot, boat
- 131 landing, or waterway, or winter sport facility.
- 132 Sections 2. and 3. remain unchanged.
- 133 4. In any recreation area between the hours of sunset and the following sunrise 10:00PM
- 134 and 6:00AM, except in designated as follows: eampgrounds. Vehicles used to transport
- watercraft are permitted at designated boat landings at any time. Regulations pertaining 135
- 136 to campground parking are listed in section 14.18 (4)(f) of this Code.
- 137 a. Vehicles of registered campers may be parked in campgrounds owned by Oneida
- 138 County at any hour. Specific regulations pertaining to campground parking are listed in
- 139 section 14.18 (4)(f) of this Code.
- 140 b. Vehicles used to transport watercraft to and from the boat landing at Townline Park
- 141 may be parked at said boat landing at any hour.
- 142 (12) FIRES. (Am. #53-2008) No person shall start, tend or maintain any fire except for
- 143 cooking, or heating, or when camping, and then only in designated fireplaces, fire-rings,
- 144 or grills in any County recreation area, boat landing and public access area. Further, no
- 145 person shall leave any fire unattended at designated fireplaces, fire-rings, or grills or
- 146 throw away any matches, cigarettes, cigars, pipe ashes or any embers without
- 147 extinguishing them, and then only in the proper receptacle.
- 148 Sections (13) remains unchanged.
- 149 (14) FIREARMS. (Am. #53-2008) No person shall possess or have under their control
- 150 any firearm, airgun, bow, crossbow, slingshot or dangerous weapon as defined in
- 151 §939.22, Wis. Stats., unless it is unloaded and enclosed in a carrying case, in any
- 152 County recreation area. Firearms, bows, and crossbows used for the purpose of
- 153 participating in a State hunting season with a valid State hunting license are authorized

- at boat landings, and public access areas, special use areas, and ski trail facilities, silent
- sports trails located outside County recreation areas, and other County forest lands. See
- section 14.18 of this Code for regulations related to hunting and trapping in County
- owned campgrounds.
- 158 (15) PETS REGULATIONS FOR RECREATION AREAS. (Am. #107-2005; #53-2008)
- No person shall allow pets to enter any public building, bathing swimming beach, picnic
- area grounds, or playgrounds, or to be on any ski trail when snow covered, or concrete
- pad surrounding a water pump within any County Recreation Area, or to run at large at
- 162 any time on County Recreation Area grounds. Pets are allowed in all other areas of
- 163 County Recreation facilities, provided they are leashed and under the owner's control at
- all times. No person shall allow their pet to deprive or disrupt the enjoyment or use of
- any County Recreation Area by others. Regulations pertaining to pets at on formally
- designated Non-Motorized Trail Facilities Silent Sports Trails are listed under 14.13
- 167 (20)(e) (21). Regulations pertaining to pets at designated campgrounds are listed under
- 168 14.18 (4)(c). In other County facilities, pets are permitted provided they are effectively
- 169 restrained or under the owner's control at all times, no person shall allow their pet to
- 170 deprive or disrupt the enjoyment or use of any area by others.
- 171 (16) HORSES. (Am. #107-2005) No person shall ride a horse on any non-motorized
- trails formally designated silent sports trails or have a horse in any County recreation
- area. Organized events or commercial rides will require Committee approval as set forth
- in 525.5 of the current County Forest Ten Fifteen-Year Plan.
- 175 (17) BICYCLES. (Am. #107-2005) No person shall ride a bicycle in any County
- recreation area except on asphalt roads or parking areas, unless signed or formally
- 177 <u>designated</u> otherwise.
- 178 Sections (18) remains unchanged.
- 179 (19) BEACHES.
- 180 (a) Bathing dress. No person shall sunbathe or swim at enter the water, onto any bathing
- beach, or County recreation area or beach without wearing a swimsuit or other
- appropriate attire. unless clothed in a suitable bathing dress or suit. The object of this
- subsection is to prevent nudity.
- 184 The balance of this section remains unchanged.
- 185 (20) NON-MOTORIZED SILENT SPORTS TRAIL FACILITIES. (Am. #107-2005)
- 186 (a) No motorized vehicles are allowed on the non-motorized trail network silent sports
- 187 <u>trails</u> except those being used for inspection, or maintenance, or as authorized by the
- 188 Forestry Department.
- 189 Sections (b) and (c) remain unchanged.
- 190 (d) A non-transferable valid trail pass is required by individuals eighteen years of age
- and older to bike, ski, or snowshoe on trails designated, signed, and otherwise
- maintained specifically for said activities.
- 193 (1)1. Annual Trail Passes are available for a cost of \$20.00 each. Annual Trail Passes
- are valid for a 1-year period from January 1st through December 31st of each calendar
- 195 year.
- 196 (2)2. Daily Trail Passes are available for a cost of \$5.00 each. Daily Trail Passes are
- only valid for the date that is entered on the registration form.
- 198 (3)3. Trail users must have a valid trail pass in their possession while biking, skiing or
- snowshoeing on designated trails.
- 200 (4)4. Trail Passes become valid upon a (completed registration form and appropriate
- user fee) being submitted to the Oneida County Forestry, Land, and Outdoor Recreation
- 202 Department in any one of the following acceptable methods:
- The balance of this section remains unchanged.
- 204 (e) Pet regulations for Silent Sports Trails:

- 205 <u>1. When silent sports trails are located within the boundary of a formally designated</u>
- 206 County Recreation Area, pet regulations for County Recreation Areas supersede those
- 207 <u>for Silent Sports Trails. The following silent sports trails, or segments thereof, must</u>
- 208 follow pet regulations for County Recreation Facilities listed under 14.13(15):
- 209 <u>a. That portion of the Washburn Silent Sports Trail located</u> within the boundary of Perch Lake Park.
- b. The Upland Trail located within the boundary of Almon Park.
- 212 c. The Wetland Trail located within the boundary of Almon Park.
- 2. Pets are permitted on all silent sports trails when said trails are not snow covered,
- 214 provided that said pets are under the owners voice control or leashed.
- 215 3. Winter ski trail pet regulations. The following regulations are enforced when ski trails
- are snow covered or being periodically groomed for cross-country skiing:
- 217 <u>a. Pets are not allowed on the following ski trails: Washburn ski trail, and the Cassian</u>
- 218 <u>Two-Way Ski Trail.</u>
- b. Pets are allowed on the following ski trails: Enterprise Primitive Ski Trail, and the Nose
- 220 <u>Lake Ski Trail.</u>
- 4. Snowshoe trail pet regulations. The following regulations are enforced when
- 222 <u>snowshoe trails are snow covered:</u>
- 223 <u>a. Pets are not allowed on the Washburn Snowshoe Trail.</u>
- b. Pets are allowed on the following snowshoe trails: Enterprise Primitive Snowshoe
- 225 Trail, Almon Park Wetland Trail, and the Almon Park Upland Trail.
- 226 (e) During periods of snow cover, dogs are permitted on signed or otherwise maintained
- 227 snow-shoe and or cross country ski trails at the following Non-Motorized Trail Facilities,
- 228 provided that the dog is under the owner's voice control at all times.
- 229 1. Enterprise Primitive Cross-Country Skiing, and Snowshoe Trail.
- 230 2. Nose Lake Ski Trail.
- 231 3. Almon Park Wetland Trail.
- 232 4. Almon Park Upland Trail.
- 233 Sections (21) and (22) remain unchanged.
