2013 Audit Report by Schenck and Associates - Dave Maccoux gave a brief presentation to the County Board explaining the 2013 audit and also stated the County is in good financial shape for the year of 2014. There is \$17,801, 519 total in the fund balance at the end of 2013. \$11,051,591 is unassigned and approximately 2 to 3 million dollars from the unassigned general fund may be used for one time projects.

<u>Code of Conduct Hearing Report / Dispute Resolution Committee's</u> Recommendations

Chairman, David Hintz highlighted some of the items in the report and stated the County Board is not bound by the dispute resolution committees' recommendations. Hintz stated the first complaint was filed by Supervisor Ted Cushing, on May 22, 2014 and the second complaint was filed by Supervisor Lance Krolczyk on May 23, 2014. The subject of both complaints center on comments made by Supervisor Sorensen during the May 20, 2014 County Board meeting. The comments were concerning campaign literature distributed for the April 2014 Election.

The recommendation of the Dispute Resolution Committee's:

#1. Supervisor Cushing complaint withdrawal be accepted by the Oneida County Board of Supervisors.

#2. That Supervisor Sorensen not be found to have violated the Oneida County Board code of Conduct.

<u>Presentation by the Administration Committee regarding County</u> Administrator and County Board Size

Supervisor Fried and Sorensen inquired if a motion could be made to "kill" the issue of the Administrator and resizing the County Board. Per Brian Desmond, Corporation Counsel, formal actions would need to be taken on the Resolutions that were brought before the County Board and previously tabled. Desmond stated it was part of the original motion to bring a report back to the County Board in August with the findings.

Chairman David Hintz gave a brief presentation on pursuing an Administrator and the County Board Size. A sub-committee was formed. There were advantages and disadvantages for both. Hiring an Administrator will dramatically change the operations of Oneida County. Also, the cost and funding of this position plus an assistant is estimated at \$250 k/per year. The County Board reduction size for the County Board committee that was discussed was nine members and it was felt that it would be difficult to reduce the County Board size without hiring an administrator. More discussion took place.

<u>Motion/Second:</u> Fried/Sorensen to "Kill" the hiring of a County Administrator and the reduction of the County Board size and not to spend anymore time pursuing or reviewing this by the committee.

Per Brian Desmond, the Resolutions will have to be brought back next month (September 23, 2014) for formal action.

WHEREAS, the State of Wisconsin has yet to take advantage of new federal Medicaid dollars which would have improved the state's Badger Care program, and that these federal funds are available at any time, and upon acceptance would provide access to Badger Care to 84,000 people as estimated by the State's Legislative Fiscal Bureau; and

WHEREAS, 19 counties have passed resolutions urging Wisconsin to utilize these federal funds, a position that has been reiterated by the Wisconsin Counties Association, and that these federal funds would help 684 -parents and childless adults in Oneida County access Badger Care; and

WHEREAS, being underinsured and uninsured impacts County Human Services Departments because it can lead to untreated mental health or substance abuse, impacts Social Services by increasing the number of people that require services, and lack preventive health care that can lead to loss of jobs, the inability to function, loss of self-sufficiency, and impacts the health and economy of the community.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the Oneida County Board of Supervisors hereby directs the County Clerk to place the following advisory referendum question on a countywide ballot:

"Shall the next State Legislature accept available federal funds for Badger Care?" to ensure that thousands of Wisconsin citizens have access to quality and affordable health coverage?"

BE IT FINALLY RESOLVED that a copy of this resolution be sent to the Oneida County legislative delegation, Governor Scott Walker, and the Wisconsin Counties Association.



And being duly advised of the wishes of the people in the area affected as follows:

WHEREAS; the owner of the property would like to have the ability to build a personal storage building larger than 1008 square feet without a single family dwelling unit and:

WHEREAS, the Town of Minocqua approved the request (copy attached) and;

WHEREAS, On July 2, 2014 the Planning and Development Committee held a Public Hearing and the adjoining landowners were provided with a written notice of the change and nobody had concerns for or against the change and;

WHEREAS; The Planning & Development Committee has reviewed the general standards as specified in Section 9.86F of the Oneida County Zoning & Shoreland Protection Ordinance and concluded that the standards have been met. The Planning & Development Committee recommends passage.
