ACCEPT THE MINUTES OF THE NOVEMBER 12, 2014 ANNUAL BUDGET MEETING.

MOTION/SECOND: Cushing/Rudolph to accept the minutes of the November 12, 2014 Annual Budget meeting. Corrections, Deletions, Additions: Supervisor Rudolph stated on page 2, fourth line from the bottom, the numbers \$1000,000 in that line should be \$1,000, there are too many zero's. Page 5, Supervisor Rudolph felt that after BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, there was an amendment made to change the resolution #88-2014 to indicate that the Forestry Committee Chair was authorized to sign the agreement for the annual work plan and not the County Board Chair. It was noted on Page 5 that there is a motion that states this and that the original resolution is corrected as amended and states both are required to sign. Supervisor VanRaalte states Page 7, third line from the bottom the word "and" should be "an". All "aye" on amended minutes, motion carries.

Highway Facility Evaluation Update & Report

Chairman Dave Hintz states that along with himself there will be two other members of the committee who will speak on the Highway Facility Evaluation - Supervisor's Bob Mott and Robb Jensen.

Supervisor Mott updated the County Board by giving a chronological report of the Highway Facility Evaluation.

Chronological Report of Highway Facility Evaluation Committee

Early August 2014

- Kwik Trip offered \$2.3 million to purchase a14 acre site. (Oneida County Highway Facility)
- Deadline to reply by August 24, 2014

August 14, 2014

 Oneida County Land Records and Oneida County Public Works/Solid Waste Committees reviewed the offer – passed it on to the Oneida County Board to consider the merits of the offer.

August 21, 2014

- Special Oneida County Board meeting
- Presentation by Kwik Trip
 - 5-6 acres to be developed for Kwik Trip facility; the rest for later development.
 - Could open in 2017 or 2018
 - Employ around 40 workers
- Blaine Osborn, Rhinelander City Administrator, reported that, more than likely a Tax Incremental Financing (TIF) district would be created and the site annexed to the City for sewer and water.
- A 35 acre site near Pizza Haven, owned by Oneida County, is being considered for a new site
- Oneida County Board voted to seek an extension from Kwik Trip to February 1, 2015 in order to gain more information on the offer and associated costs of remodeling or building new.

December 2, 2014

- Proposals were presented by
 - Venture Architects
 - Barrientos Design/Consulting
 - Devine Inc.
 - TJK Design/Build
- All gave excellent presentations
- Bids were opened in closed session
- Committee gave their reactions to presentations

December 5, 2014

- Teleconference held with top two companies for additional information Venture and Barrientos
- Barrientos was selected
- Committee decided to ask for extension beyond the February 1, 2015 date to allow complete evaluation and reach conclusions

Supervisor Jensen stated the Committee came up with a pretty good estimate of a new facility. But looking at the current facility, he stated that the Committee didn't have the expertise to evaluate it, particularly structurally. The Committee needs to know:

- What are the required codes

- Safety issues
- Are there any physical plant deficiencies that go along with the current facility
- Are there any operational or spacial deficiencies that need to be addressed

Supervisor Jensen stated in mid-November letters were sent out to companies requesting a proposal on reviewing the existing Highway Department and also what a new facility would look like. Four firms presented bids; the bids were opened in closed session in which Barrientos Design/Consulting was selected. Supervisor Jensen discussed Barrientos plan for the Highway Department and also discussed what Barrientos presented for a new facility. Supervisor Jensen stated we would have to bring-in someone to do site borings to make sure the new site would be good from a soil stand-point.

Chairman Hintz added additional considerations and recommendations. He stated getting costs on a new facility is easier because you can compare to different counties. A new Kwik Trip on the Highway Department site would improve the area and a TIF (Tax Increment Financing) District could be established for that area of town. This would allow dollars that would have been paid in taxes to improve the area (example: put in new roads, sidewalk, sewers etc.). Hintz states we had preliminary discussions with the City of Rhinelander on the TIF district and that is yet to be decided. Other considerations are financing options and net cost to the taxpayer. Our Highway Facility needs some upgrading and we need to know the costs. A new facility would be safer and provide increased efficiency. More consideration is the price that Kwik Trip offered; if we wait what would the price be in a couple years.

Recommendations from the Highway Facility Evaluation Committee and the Administration Committee are in two resolutions with two proposals and monies to come from the contingency fund. The first proposal is to accept the Barrientos Design and Consulting proposal; the cost is \$12,720 (a very reasonable cost). Other proposals received were significantly more. The Highway facility Evaluation Committee and Administration Committee both feel the level of this proposal will give us the level of detailed numbers needed to move forward and make the right decision. Barrientos has a significant level of experience. They have listed upgrades in categories. Also, a resolution for a recommendation will be coming to extend up to \$7,000 for additional items needed to complete the study. Kwik Trip will extend to May 1, 2015 on their offer and will work out any detail with Brian Desmond, Corporation Counsel. More discussion will take place in closed session. Our current facility is 50,000 square feet; we are looking at a new facility of approximately 72,000 square feet, a \$10 to \$16 million project. This project should also take in consideration of the impact on the tax base.

More discussion took place within the County Board members.

Resolved by the Board of Supervisors of Oneida County, Wisconsin:

WHEREAS, Oneida County has over 1300 lakes, rivers, and streams, and contains one of the highest concentrations of natural lakes in the world, and

WHEREAS, the quality of these waters is being threatened by aquatic invasive species; and

WHEREAS, Oneida County recognizes the importance of the quality of our waters to its citizens and local economies, and

WHEREAS, education is one of the keys to increasing public awareness as to the adverse impacts of aquatic invasive species on the quality of our waters and our local economies; and

WHEREAS, Oneida County recognizes the need for a workable plan that will prevent the introduction of aquatic invasive species into new waters, and control, reduce, or eliminate aquatic invasive species already present in some bodies of water; and

WHEREAS, the Oneida County Land & Water Conservation Department (LWCD) will continue to increase public awareness of the aquatic invasive species problem by implementing planning and prevention activities to control and prevent the spread of aquatic invasive species at an estimated cost of \$ 62,053.00, which includes Oneida County's 25% match and

WHEREAS, 75% percent of the cost of such planning and prevention activities may be paid by a grant from the Wisconsin Department of Natural Resources (WDNR), and

WHEREAS, the LWCD must apply for a grant through the "Aquatic Invasive Species" grant program through the WDNR to receive funding.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the LWCD is authorized to apply for 75% funding assistance for such programming under the "Aquatic Invasive Species" Grant Program from the WDNR.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Oneida County Board of Supervisors hereby authorizes the Chairman of the Conservation and UW-EX Education Committee, to submit an application for a one-year grant to the WDNR not to exceed \$50,000 in grant funds for an aquatic invasive species education, planning, and prevention program, to sign documents and take necessary action to undertake, direct, complete the approved aquatic invasive species control grant, and submit reimbursement claims along with necessary supporting documentation within six months of project completion date.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the LWCD is authorized to meet the County's 25% share of the financial obligations of this aquatic invasive species grant, through the assignment of LWCD personnel to work on and complete the project, including timely publication of the results.

WHEREAS, the Labor Relations Employee Services Committee (hereinafter LRES Committee), has reviewed the wage schedules for all general municipal employees for calendar year 2015 and the CPIU increase of 1.57%, as prepared by the Wisconsin Employment Relations Commission; and

WHEREAS, the wage increase set forth below has been recommended by the LRES Committee and included in the 2015 approved budget.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the general municipal employees shall receive the following:

- Exempt and Non-exempt wage schedule shall include an increase of 1.6% to the control point (Step 6) with all other steps to be calculated based on such increase effective January 3, 2015.
- Exempt and Non-exempt red circled employees shall receive a one-time payment of 1.6% of their base salary to be paid on the payroll period ending January 16, 2015.
