If your bid is NOT SELECTED, the bid bond will be returned. If your bid is ACCEPTED, your bid bond will be held until the contract is signed on the terms below. If the contract is not signed within the required two (2) week period, your bid bond will be FORFEITED.

Irrevocable Letters of Credit and bonds will be considered on an individual basis in lieu of cash deposits.

Letters of Credit must have an expiration date one year past the contract end date.

Certificates of Insurance will be provided by the successful bidder at the signing of the contract, proving adequate liability with the limits of \$1,000,000 bodily injury and \$1,000,000 property damage and Worker's Compensation at statutory limits.

All successful bidders must provide proof of training to the State SFI standards and a completed Wisconsin Sales and Use Tax Exemption Certificate (formS-211) showing tax exemption status at contract signing.

Successful bidders must sign contracts and pay balance of deposit within two weeks of receipt. Contract expiration dates vary from one to four years and may be renewed, with increased rates, at the discretion of the Committee. Total contract period shall be no more than four years from date issued. Upon signing of each contract, a deposit of 25% of the total successful bid value will be required. The minimum rates only apply to jobs sold by competitive bidding.

- 1. Only the tree species specified on the timber sale prospectus / map are to be cut. Utilization specifications designated for the sale area must be adhered to.
- 2. Contractor must comply with Slash Disposal Law, Sec.26.12(b), Wisconsin Statutes.
- 3. A Refundable Bid Bond must accompany each bid. Bid bond will be of 5% of the total bid value, in the form of a check or cash. A Performance Bond, in the form of cash, check, or letter of credit, equaling 25% of the total bid value is due upon signing of the contract.
- 4. No forest products shall be removed until scaled and marked by a representative of the Forestry Department and paid for unless otherwise specified in the contract scaling instructions. **NOTE:** Log specifications: Small end: 10" diameter inside the bark for hardwood and 9" inside the bark for softwoods and capable of making a #3 grade log.
- 5. All timber, marked or otherwise designated by the contract to be cut, shall be cut progressively and to the satisfaction of the representative of the Forestry Department, whether or not the quantity of such timber is more or less than the estimated comprising the operational specifications.
- 6. Undesignated trees cut or injured through carelessness and designated trees left through carelessness shall be paid for at double the stumpage rate. Timber wasted in tops and stumps shall be paid for at the stumpage rate.
- 7. Purchaser agrees to assume all liability for any damage or injury to persons or property, real or personal, resulting from Purchaser's operations under this contract and will hold Oneida County harmless from the same. The contractor shall furnish certification to the Oneida County Forestry Department that he / she is adequately insured with a reliable company so that Oneida County shall not be held liable in case of injury or death during and after the contract period. The limits of liability shall be \$1,000,000.00 bodily injury and \$1,000,000.00 property damage. The contractor shall also furnish proof of Workers Compensation Insurance at statutory limits. In the event the Purchaser's insurance is terminated for any reason, he / she shall immediately cease all activities otherwise permitted by the contract and provide written notice to the Forestry Department.
- 8. Roadways and trails will be kept free from brush, logs, pulp and waste material resulting from the operation. The Purchaser must abide by all rules regarding the use of roads, trails, and fire lanes. Additional constructed roads or trails must meet the approval of the Forestry Department.
- **9.** Contractors will be required to furnish the Forestry Department with proof of SFI Logger Certification and a completed Wisconsin Sales and Use Tax Exemption Certificate (form S-211) showing tax exemption status prior to signing contracts.

- 10. If, in the opinion of the Forestry Department, it is deemed that Contact provision are not being adhered to, all logging operations will be suspended. Operations may not be resumed without notification of the Forestry Department.
- 11. The Forestry Committee shall be the sole judge as to satisfactory compliance of contract conditions.
- 12. Timber sale contracts cannot be assigned in whole or in part without the consent of the Forestry Committee.
- 13. Any or all bids may be rejected by the Committee.



- In the marked hardwood area, harvest all orange marked trees (leaving orange visible on the stump when possible) as well as aspen and ironwood of 1" diameter or larger. EXTREME CAUTION must be used to protect existing hardwood regeneration. 

1. In the Marked Harvest Area cut all trees marked with orange paint, leaving orange visible on the stump, AND all Aspen, Fir and Ironwood over 1" DBH. Extreme caution must be used to protect existing regeneration. Excessive damage to regen may result in further equipment restrictions (such as no hot saws), or contract cancelation.

In the Coppice area cut all trees (including 1"-5" DBH), EXCEPT for White Spruce.

Utilization on all species is a 100" stick to a 4" top. NO WHOLE TREE OR POLE LENGTH SKIDDING. Any den or nest trees shall be left uncut. Standing dead trees are not to be cut unless they pose a safety hazard. All stands are bounded by red paint line, except along the Town roads.

- 3. New roads may be permitted with prior approval of the county. Existing roads may be opened and improved and landing sites may be constructed with prior approval of the County. Roads must be leveled and left in as good or better condition at the end of the sale. Roads must be blocked with berms or rocks at the end of each harvest season and at the end of the sale. Bond money will not be returned until all road/landing rehabilitation is complete.
- 4. No equipment or slash is allowed in the wetland areas within or adjacent to the sale. Equipment may not be operated within 15 feet of any wetland unless ground is dry or frozen. If grass opening is used as a landing it must be graded smooth with all top soil returned to disturbed areas. Survey corner and bearing trees are painted BLUE. DO NOT CUT/DAMAGE BEARING TREES.
- 5. Slash must be pulled back a minimum of 25 ft from the edge of the Town and County Forest roads and must be cut to no higher than 2 ft off the ground within 50 ft of the road. Decking or skidding on the Town roads is prohibited unless permission is obtained from the Town of Little Rice. The road must be repaired to the satisfaction of the Town if it is used for skidding or decking. Skidding on Rozell Rd is only permitted when road is frozen. 



- 1. In the Thinning Area (61 acres) cut all pine marked with orange paint and all merchantable hardwood and balsam fir. 2nd thinning, average diameter of pine is 9.6". 4th thinning, average diameter of pine is 14.8". In Clearcut Area (11 acres) cut all stems 4" and greater, EXCEPT aspen. Utilization on all species is a 100" stick to a 4" top. Any den or nest trees shall be left uncut. Standing dead trees are not to be cut unless they pose a safety hazard, EXCEPT in clearcut areas.
- 2. Year-round harvesting is permitted when ground is dry or frozen. Time restrictions may be imposed if rutting occurs in the woods or on roads or if excessive damage to the residual trees occurs.
- 3. No new roads will be permitted. Existing roads may be opened and improved and landing sites may be constructed with prior approval of the County. Lamer Springs, McCord, and Willow Falls Roads must be kept open and in a safe useable condition at all times. All trails will be returned to their original condition or better at the end of sale. Bond money will not be returned until all road and landing rehab is complete. Decking and skidding is prohibited on town roads unless permission is obtained from the Town.
- 4. All pine product cut between May 1 and September 1 must be removed from the sale area within 2 weeks from the time of harvest. Pine products cut during the remainder of the year must be removed prior to May 1 of each year. No whole tree skidding is allowed, maximum of 17' pole length, utility poles dealt with on a case-by-case basis.
- 5. No equipment or slash is allowed in the wetland areas within or adjacent to the sale. Equipment may not be operated within 15 feet of any wetland unless ground is dry or frozen.
- 6. Lamer Springs, McCord, and Willow Falls Roads are used as ATV and snowmobile trails. Slash must be pulled back a minimum of 10 feet from the edge of town roads and must be cut to no higher than 2 feet off the ground within 50 feet of these roads. If operations occur during ATV/snowmobile season, cautionary signs must be placed at both ends of the sale.
- 7. All items listed in the Oneida County Timber Sale Contract apply. All BMPs will be followed.

If harvesting whole tree, every 10th tree top above the 4" diameter must be left evenly scattered in the harvest area. Any den or nest trees shall be left uncut. Standing dead trees are not to be cut unless they pose a safety hazard.

2. Extremely dry or frozen ground conditions will be required for harvesting and hauling activities. Block B will be limited to a period of September 16 - March 15 due to a threatened animal species.

Time restrictions may be imposed if rutting occurs in the woods or on the roads or if excessive damage to the residual trees occurs.

- 3. No new roads will be permitted. Existing woods roads may be opened and improved and landing sites may be constructed with prior approval of the County. All trails will be returned to their original condition or better at the end of sale. Road in Block A must be bermed/rocked after each harvest season and at the end of the sale. Bond money will not be returned until all road/landing rehabilitation is complete.
- 4. No equipment or slash is allowed in the wetland areas within or adjacent to the sale. Equipment may not be operated within 15 feet of any wetland unless ground is dry or frozen.
- 5. Slash must be pulled back a minimum of 25 ft from the edge of the town road and must be cut to no higher than 2 ft off the ground within 50 ft of the road.
- 6. Decking on North Turcott Rd or Thunder Creek Rd will only be allowed with the permission of the Town of Lynne. Any damage to the road will be immediately repaired by the contractor to the satisfaction of the Town.



- 1. In the aspen area, cut all aspen, maples, white birch, ash, basswood, balsam fir, elm and ironwood 1" diameter or larger. Do not cut any other species. In the marked hardwood area, harvest all balsam fir and ironwood 1" or larger, aspen 8" or larger, and all trees marked with orange paint, leaving orange visible on the stump. Slash must be evenly distributed across sale area (no large piles). Utilization on all species is a 100" stick to a 4" top or whole tree. If harvesting whole tree, every 10th tree top above the 4" diameter must be left evenly scattered in the harvest area. Any den or nest trees shall be left uncut. Standing dead trees are not to be cut unless they pose a safety hazard. No grapple skidding is allowed in the marked hardwood.
- 2. Dry or frozen ground conditions are required for harvesting and hauling activities in some wetter areas. Year round logging operations may be permitted in the aspen area as long as rutting or road damage does not occur. Harvesting/skidding in the marked hardwood is limited to July 15th through the following spring break-up (approx March 15th). Further seasonal restrictions may be imposed if excessive rutting occurs in the woods or on the roads or if excessive damage to the residual trees occurs.
- 3. No new roads are permitted. Existing roads may be opened and improved and landing sites may be constructed with prior approval of the County. More direct access may be established by going through private property that lies directly north of the sale, however, permission will need to be obtained from the landowner along with a mutually agreed upon location. All trails and roads must be returned to their original condition or better at the end of sale. Bond money will not be returned until all road/landing rehabilitation is complete. If access is gained through the private grass opening (G), the GIS monument (alumminum pipe flush with the ground) must NOT be disturbed in any way.
- 4. No equipment is allowed in wetland areas within or adjacent to the sale unless the ground is dry or frozen. No slash is to be left in any wetlands within or adjacent to the sale. Equipment may not be operated within 15 feet of any wetland unless the ground is dry or frozen. All slash is to be pulled back onto county property. Trees felled across the BPL must be pulled back into the sale area prior to limbing.
- 5. Survey of the private property line on the north end of the sale is in progress. Once the survey is complete, the property line will be painted in with blue paint and the strip between the current red line and property line will be marked and added to the sale (4 ac).



- 1. In the coppice area, harvest all aspen, maple, jack pine, and white birch 1" diameter or larger and orange marked trees. In the pine thinning areas, harvest all orange-marked trees, aspen and maple. Standing dead trees are not to be cut unless they pose a safety hazard. Harvesting may be suspended or contract cancelled if excessive rutting or damage to residuals occurs.
- 2. Utilization on all species is a 100" stick to a 4" top or whole tree. If harvesting whole tree, every 10 th top above the standard 4" top shall be left evenly scattered throughout the sale area. Slash is to be pulled back from the edge of Cruisers Road a minimum of 25 feet and lopped to <2 feet tall within 50 feet of Cruisers Road. - 1. In the orange marked strip-clearcut areas, bounded by orange paint, harvest all trees 4" and larger (other than cedar and red pine). Utilization on all species is a 100" stick to a 4" top. Any den or nest trees will be left alone in both areas. Standing dead trees are not to be cut unless they pose a safety hazard. All saplings, except ironwood, up to 3 inches must be left. As much tag alder as possible should be cut or run over.
- 2. Logging activities are limited to winter only, with frozen grounds to prevent rutting and soil structure damage. Additional time restrictions may be imposed if excessive rutting occurs in the woods or on the roads or if excessive damage to the residual trees occurs. If, in the opinion of the County, excessive damage to the residual stand cannot be avoided by the Contractor, additional harvesting restrictions will be imposed or the Contract may be cancelled.
- 3.All trails and landings must have approval of the County prior to construction. Following completion of the sale, all trails will be returned to their original condition or better. Bond money will not be returned until all road work is completed.
