If your bid is NOT SELECTED, the bid bond will be returned. If your bid is ACCEPTED, your bid bond will be held until the contract is signed on the terms below. If the contract is not signed within the required two (2) week period, your bid bond will be FORFEITED.

Irrevocable Letters of Credit and bonds will be considered on an individual basis in lieu of cash deposits.

#### Letters of Credit must have an expiration date one year past the contract end date.

Certificates of Insurance will be provided by the successful bidder at the signing of the contract, proving adequate liability with the limits of \$1,000,000 bodily injury and \$1,000,000 property damage and Worker's Compensation at statutory limits.

All successful bidders must provide proof of training to the State SFI standards and a completed Wisconsin Sales and Use Tax Exemption Certificate (formS-211) showing tax exemption status at contract signing.

Successful bidders must sign contracts and pay balance of deposit within two weeks of receipt. Contract expiration dates vary from one to four years and may be renewed, with increased rates, at the discretion of the Committee. Total contract period shall be no more than four years from date issued. Upon signing of the contract, a deposit of 25% of the total successful bid value will be required. The minimum rates only apply to jobs sold by competitive bidding.



It is the bidder's responsibility to contact individual towns to determine if there are town ordinances relating to logging operations on town roads. PLEASE NOTE: Oneida County Forest Roads (Bowman Rd, John's Memorial Dr, Zimmer Rd, Shingle Mill Rd, Camp Six Rd, South Exit Rd, Bass Lake Rd, Cruisers Rd and Rozell Rd) *are not maintained in the winter by the County*. It is the responsibility of the Contractor to arrange snow plowing on these roads.

All sales are subject to the following conditions:

- 1. Only the tree species specified on the timber sale prospectus / map are to be cut. Utilization specifications designated for the sale area must be adhered to.
- 2. Contractor must comply with Slash Disposal Law, Sec.26.12(b), Wisconsin Statutes.
- 3. A Refundable Bid Bond must accompany each bid. Bid bond will be of 5% of the total bid value, in the form of a check or cash. A Performance Bond, in the form of cash, check, or letter of credit, equaling 25% of the total bid value is due upon signing of the contract.
- 4. No forest products shall be removed until scaled and marked by a representative of the Forestry Department and paid for unless otherwise specified in the contract scaling instructions. **NOTE:** Log specifications Small end: 10" diameter inside the bark for hardwood and 9" inside the bark for softwoods and capable of making a #3 grade log.
- 5. All timber, marked or otherwise designated by the contract to be cut, shall be cut progressively and to the satisfaction of the representative of the Forestry Department, whether or not the quantity of such timber is more or less than the estimated comprising the operational specifications.
- 6. Undesignated trees cut or injured through carelessness and designated trees left through carelessness shall be paid for at double the stumpage rate. Timber wasted in tops and stumps shall be paid for at the stumpage rate.
- 7. Purchaser agrees to assume all liability for any damage or injury to persons or property, real or personal, resulting from Purchaser's operations under this contract and will hold Oneida County harmless from the same. The contractor shall furnish certification to the Oneida County Forestry Department that he / she is adequately insured with a reliable company so that Oneida County shall not be held liable in case of injury or death during and after the contract period. The limits of liability shall be \$1,000,000.00 bodily injury and \$1,000,000.00 property damage. The contractor shall also furnish proof of Workers Compensation Insurance at statutory limits. In the event the Purchaser's insurance is terminated for any reason, he / she shall immediately cease all activities otherwise permitted by the contract and provide written notice to the Forestry Department.
- 8. Roadways and trails will be kept free from brush, logs, pulp and waste material resulting from the operation. The Purchaser must abide by all rules regarding the use of roads, trails, and fire lanes. Additional constructed roads or trails must meet the approval of the Forestry Department.
- **9.** Contractors will be required to furnish the Forestry Department with proof of SFI Logger Certification and a completed Wisconsin Sales and Use Tax Exemption Certificate (form S-211) showing tax exemption status prior to signing contracts.

- 10. If, in the opinion of the Forestry Department, it is deemed that Contact provision are not being adhered to, all logging operations will be suspended. Operations may not be resumed without notification of the Forestry Department.
- 11. The Forestry Committee shall be the sole judge as to satisfactory compliance of contract conditions.
- 12. Timber sale contracts cannot be assigned in whole or in part without the consent of the Forestry Committee.
- 13. Any or all bids may be rejected by the Committee.
- 14. <u>ALL BIDS PER SPECIES MUST MEET MINIMUM BID PRICE AS STATED ON PROSPECTUS.</u>
- 15. Sample copies of County timber sale contracts are available for review at the Forestry Office in the Oneida County Court House.
- 16. All contracts will expire after the term indicated on the sale prospectus / map. One year extensions may be granted at the discretion of the Forestry, Land & Recreation Committee. Stumpage rates will be increased according to the following schedule:

One Year Contract: 1st Extension 5% rate increase

2nd Extension 10% rate increase 3rd Extension 15% rate increase

Two Year Contract: 1st Extension 10% rate increase

2nd Extension 15% rate increase

Three Year Contract: 1st Extension 15% rate increase

Total contract period, plus extensions, shall be no more than four years from date issued.



#### HARVEST REGULATIONS

- 1. **Pine Harvest Area**: (42 acres) Cut all pine and maple 1-inch dbh and greater, red oak >6" dbh, and white birch >6" dbh. Do NOT cut or damage any other species including burr oak and purple painted trees. Average diameter of white pine is 23" and average diameter of red pine is 18".
- 2. **Aspen Harvest Area**: (2 acres) No paint line designates this area, only obvious cover type change. Cut all trees 1-inch dbh and greater EXCEPT pine, spruce, cedar, and hemlock.
- 3. **Hardwood Regen Areas**: (5 acres) The northernmost Hardwood Regen Area is lined with purple paint and remaining Hardwood Regen Areas are not demarcated in the field by paint or flag lines. Do not cut any trees in these areas. Do not drop trees into or skid trees through these areas.
- 4. **Seasonal Restrictions**: Harvesting and hauling is allowed with very dry or frozen ground. Harvesting is not allowed from April 15 to July 15. All pine products cut between May 1 and September 1 must be removed from the sale area within 2 weeks from the time of harvest. Pine products cut during the remainder of the year must be removed prior to May 1 of each year. Further restrictions may be imposed if excessive rutting occurs in the woods, on woods roads or town roads, or if excessive damage to residual trees occurs.
- 5. Roads and Access: Skidding or decking on Trout Creek Road is permitted only with permission of the Town of Woodboro. All damage to roads must be repaired immediately to the satisfaction of the Town. If decking occurs on town roads, decks must be far enough off the roadto prevent safety issues. All bark and debris must be removed from the town road daily and completely at the end of the sale. Existing woods roads may be improved, and landings and turn-arounds constructed with prior approval of the County. All woods roads must be leveled and blocked with rocks or gate if previously blocked at the end of each harvesting season and at the end of the sale. Bond money will not be returned until all road/landing rehabilitation is complete to the satisfaction of the County. Slash must be pulled back a minimum of 10 feet from the edge of town roads and must be cut to no higher than 2 feet off the ground within 20 feet of this road. Cautionary signs must be placed along Trout Creek Road at both ends of the sale area forthe duration of all harvest and trucking operations.
- 6. **Utilization:** Utilization on all species is a 100" stick to a 4" top. Whole tree utilization is not allowed. Any den or nest trees shall beleft uncut. Standing dead trees are not to be cut unless they pose a safety hazard. No whole tree skidding is allowed. Maximum of 17' pole length. Utility poles will be dealt with on a case-by-case basis. Any trees felled across the blue painted line must be pulled back completely onto county property before being processed.
- 7. **Wetland and Waterway BMPs**: No equipment is allowed to operate within 15 feet of any wetland or ephemeral pond within or adjacent to the sale unless he ground is very dry or frozen. No slash is to be left in any wetland or ephemeral pond.
- 8. Contract: All items listed in the Oneida County Timber Sale Contract apply. All applicable BMPs will be enforced.

Harvest Regulations:


1. Selection Harvest Area: Cut all trees marked with orange paint, leaving orange visible on the stump, AND all Aspen, Balsam Fir and Ironwood over 1" DBH and Black Ash over 8" DBH. Extreme caution must be used to protect existing regeneration. Excessive damage to regen may result in further equipment restrictions (such as no hot saws), or contract cancellation.

Utilization on all species is a 100" stick to a 4" top. NO WHOLE TREE OR POLE LENGTH SKIDDING. Any den or nest trees shall be left uncut. Standing dead trees are not to be cut unless they pose a safety hazard. Red paint line surrounds sale area.


- 2. Seasonal Restriction: Dry or frozen ground conditions will be required for harvesting and hauling activities. Harvesting operations are limited to July 15th to the following spring breakup period (approximately March 15). Further time restrictions may be imposed if excessive rutting occurs in the woods or on the roads or if excessive damage to the residual trees occurs.
- 3. No new roads are permitted. Existing roads may be opened and improved and landing sites may be constructed with prior approval of the County. Roads must stay within their original footprint and no landings may be constructed north of the red paint line. Roads must be leveled and left in as good or better condition at the end of the sale. Main access road must be blocked with berm or rocks at the end of each harvest season. Bond money will not be returned until all road/landing rehabilitation is complete.
- 4. ABSOLUTELY NO ACTIVITY IS ALLOWED WITHIN THE GREEN LINED EXCLUSION AREAS OR OUTSIDE OF MAIN ACCESS ROAD NORTH OF THE SALE AREA. This includes no felling of trees into the exclusion areas. These areas have historical features. Any disturbance of the sites will result in immediate contract termination and retention of performance bond. If the contractor discovers any new historical features during this sale, the County must be immediately notified and no operation in the vicinity of the discovery may occur until authorized by the County.
- 5. No equipment or slash is allowed in the wetland areas adjacent to the sale. Equipment may not be operated within 15 feet of any wetland unless ground is dry or frozen.
- 6. Any trees felled across the blue line must be pulled back into the sale area before limbing. No equipment is allowed across the blue line.
- 7. All items listed in the Oneida County Timber Sale Contract apply. All applicable BMP's will be followed.

Harvest Regulations:

- 1. <u>Spruce Seed-tree</u>: Harvest all trees 2" DBH except cedar, hemlock, pine, red oak, birch, or any trees marked with purple paint. EXTREME CAUTION must be used to protect the existing regeneration strips and residual trees. Slash must be evenly distributed across the sale area (no large piles). Utilization on all species is a 100" stick to a 4" top. Any den or nest tree shall be left uncut. Standing dead trees are not to be cut unless they pose a safety hazard. Avoid felling trees into the existing regeneration strips.
- 2. <u>Seasonal Restrictions</u>: FROZEN GROUND CONDITONS WILL BE REQUIRED for harvesting and hauling activities. Harvesting operations will only be allowed once frozen ground conditions occur through March 5th. Harvesting/skidding in the harvest area is limited to FROZEN GROUND ONLY! Further seasonal restrictions may be imposed if excessive rutting occurs in the woods, roads, or if excessive damage to residual trees/regeneration occurs.
- 3. Roads and Access: No new roads are permitted. Existing roads may be opened and improved and landing sites may be constructed with prior approval of the County. All trails and roads must be returned to their original condition or better at the end of the sale. Any berms that are opened up must be rebuilt or replaced with rocks after each harvest season and at the end of the sale. Bond money will not be returned until all road/trail/landing rehabilitation is satisfactorily complete. Caution signs must be placed on Shingle Mill Rd.
- 4. No slash from upland areas is allowed in the harvest area. If any slash is brought in, it must be removed by the end of the sale.
- 5. No equipment is allowed within 15' of any wetlands unless the ground is frozen.
- 6. Any trees felled across the blue paint line must be completely pulled back onto County property before being limbed and processed.





#### HARVEST REGULATIONS

- 1. **Selection Harvest Area**: harvest all orange-marked trees, all balsam 1" DBH and greater, all ironwood and musclewood 1" DBH and greater, and all ash 6" DBH and greater. Utilization on all species is a 100" stick to a 4" top. Whole tree utilization is not allowed to protect residual hardwood. No whole tree skidding is allowed. Any den or nest trees shall be left uncut. Standing dead trees are not to be cut unless they pose a safety hazard. EXTREME care must be given to protecting existing hardwood regeneration.
- 2. **Seasonal Restrictions**: Dry or frozen ground conditions are required to prevent soil damage. Harvesting will be allowed only between July 15 through the following spring break-up (approximately March 15) to minimize damage to residual trees. Time restrictions may be imposed if rutting occurs in the woods or on roads or if excessive damage to residual trees occurs.
- 3. No new roads will be permitted without the permission of the County. Existing roads may be opened and landing sites may be constructed with prior approval of the County. All trails will be returned to their original condition or better at the end of the sale. Bond money will not be returned until all road and landing rehab is complete. Decking and skidding is prohibited on town roads unless permission is obtained from the Town of Lynne.
- 4. No equipment or slash is allowed in wetland or ephemerally wet areas within or adjacent to the sale. Equipment may not be operated within 15 feet of any wetland unless ground is dry or frozen.
- 5. The survey monument and any witness trees are marked with blue paint and must not be damaged.
- 6. Flowage Road is used as an ATV and snowmobile trail. The Minocqua Forest Riders snowmobile trail directly borders the sale area. Slash must be pulled back a minimum of 10 feet from the edge of the trail and must be cut to no higher than 2 feet off the ground within 25 feet of this road. If operations occur during snowmobile season, snowmobile trails directly associated with the timber sale area must remain snow-covered to the extent possible for the duration of snowmobile season. 1. Coppice Area: Cut all Aspen, Red Maple, and White Birch 1" dbh and larger. Balsam Fir can be cut/lopped and left scattered in the woods. Do not cut Cherry or Spruce.

Utilization on all species is a 100" stick to a 4" top or whole tree. If harvesting whole tree, every 10th tree top above the 4" diameter must be left evenly scattered in the harvest area. Any den or nest trees shall be left uncut. Standing dead trees are not to be cut unless they pose a safety hazard.

- 2. **Seasonal Restriction**: Dry or frozen ground conditions will be required for harvesting and hauling activities. Seasonal restrictions may be imposed if rutting occurs in the woods or on the roads or if excessive damage to the residual trees occurs. Multiple Tag Alder draws are located throughout the stand.
- 3. **Roads and access**: Approximately 0.4 miles of new woods road will need to be constructed to access the stand. The new road will be built through a young Aspen stand. Existing woods roads may be opened and improved and landing sites may be constructed with prior approval of the County. All roads will be returned to their original condition or better at the end of sale. Roads must be bermed/rocked after each harvest season and at the end of the sale if previously blocked. 

Harvest Regulations

- 1. Harvest Area (aspen coppice): cut all aspen, maples, ash, basswood, balsam fir, elm, ironwood, and musclewood 1" DBH and larger. Do not cut any other species. If harvesting in early summer, cut pieces 1 and 2 before piece 3. Slash must be evenly distributed across sale area (no large piles). Utilization on all species is a 100" stick to a 4" top or whole tree. If harvesting whole tree, every 10th tree top above the 4" diameter must be left evenly scattered in the harvest area. Any den or nest trees shall be left uncut. Standing dead trees are not to be cut unless they pose a safety hazard.
- 2. **GR Harvest:** Within the northern game opening (2 ac), labeled GR, cut all stems 1" DBH and larger regardless of listed species within the purple painted opening. Do not cut trees marked with purple paint or any trees between the red and purple paint lines. Stump heights must not exceed 10" tall within the opening.
- 3. **Seasonal restrictions:** Year round logging operations are permitted. Dry or frozen ground conditions are required for harvesting and hauling activities. Further seasonal restrictions may be imposed if excessive rutting occurs in the woods or on the roads or if excessive damage to the residual trees occurs.
- 4. **Roads and access:** No new roads permitted. Existing roads may be opened and improved and landing sites may be constructed with prior approval of the County. Access roads and trails must be bermed/rocked or gated at the end of each harvest season and at the end of the sale if previously blocked. All trails and roads must be returned to their original condition or better at the end of each harvest season and at the end of the sale. Bond money will not be returned until all road/landing rehabilitation is complete to the satisfaction of the County. The contractor must obtain permission from the Town of Woodboro prior to decking/skidding on the town roads.
- 5. No equipment is allowed in the wetland areas within or adjacent to the sale unless the ground is dry or frozen. Do not operate equipment within 15' of any wetland unless the ground is dry or frozen.
- 6. Signs will be needed on Memorial Forest Rd. to notify users of logging operations. If harvesting occurs during snowmobile season, the trail must remain snow covered to the extent possible.
- 7. Do not cut any trees within the red painted retention zones around the game openings and those within the stands. The game openings may be used as landings, but once the sale is compete, all topsoil that was removed needs to be replaced and leveled out to allow for future maintenance of the openings.
- 8. No slash is to be left in any wetlands within or adjacent to the sale area. Slash must be pulled back 10' from all trails/roads and cut to lay less than 2' high within 20' of the trails/roads. Any trees felled across the Blue Paint Line must be pulled back completely onto county property before being processed.
- 9. All items listed in the Oneida County Timber Sale Contract apply. All applicable BMP's will be followed.







- 2. **RMZ Harvest Area**: These areas are delineated by purple marked trees. Cut all aspen 4" dbh and greater. Do NOT cut any other species! Do not cut purple marked trees.
- 3. **Seasonal Restrictions**: Harvesting is allowed with very dry or frozen ground EXCEPT from May 15 to September 15. Further restrictions may be imposed if excessive rutting occurs in the woods, on woods roads or town roads, or if excessive damage to residual trees occurs.
- 4. Roads and Access: Skidding or decking on Kelly Fire Lane is permitted only with permission of the Town of Little Rice. All damage to roads must be repaired immediately to the satisfaction of the Town. If decking occurs on town roads, decks must be far enough off the road to prevent safety issues. All bark and debris must be removed from the town road daily and completely at the end of the sale. Existing woods roads may be improved, and landings and turn-arounds constructed with prior approval of the County. No new roads may be constructed. All woods roads must be levelled and blocked with rocks or gate if previously blocked at the end of each harvesting season and at the end of the sale. Grass openings may be used as landings, but at time of sale completion, all topsoil that was disturbed or removed shall be replaced and leveled to allow for future maintenance of the openings. Bond money will not be returned until all road/landing rehabilitation is complete to the satisfaction of the County.
- 5. **Utilization**: Utilization is 100" stick to a 4" top or whole tree. If harvesting whole tree, every 10<sup>th</sup> top above the standard 4" top shall be left evenly scattered throughout the sale area. Slash is to be pulled back from the edge of the gravel portion of town roads a minimum of 10 feet and cut to no higher than 2 feet from the ground throughout the sale.
