

- PSC - Unserved

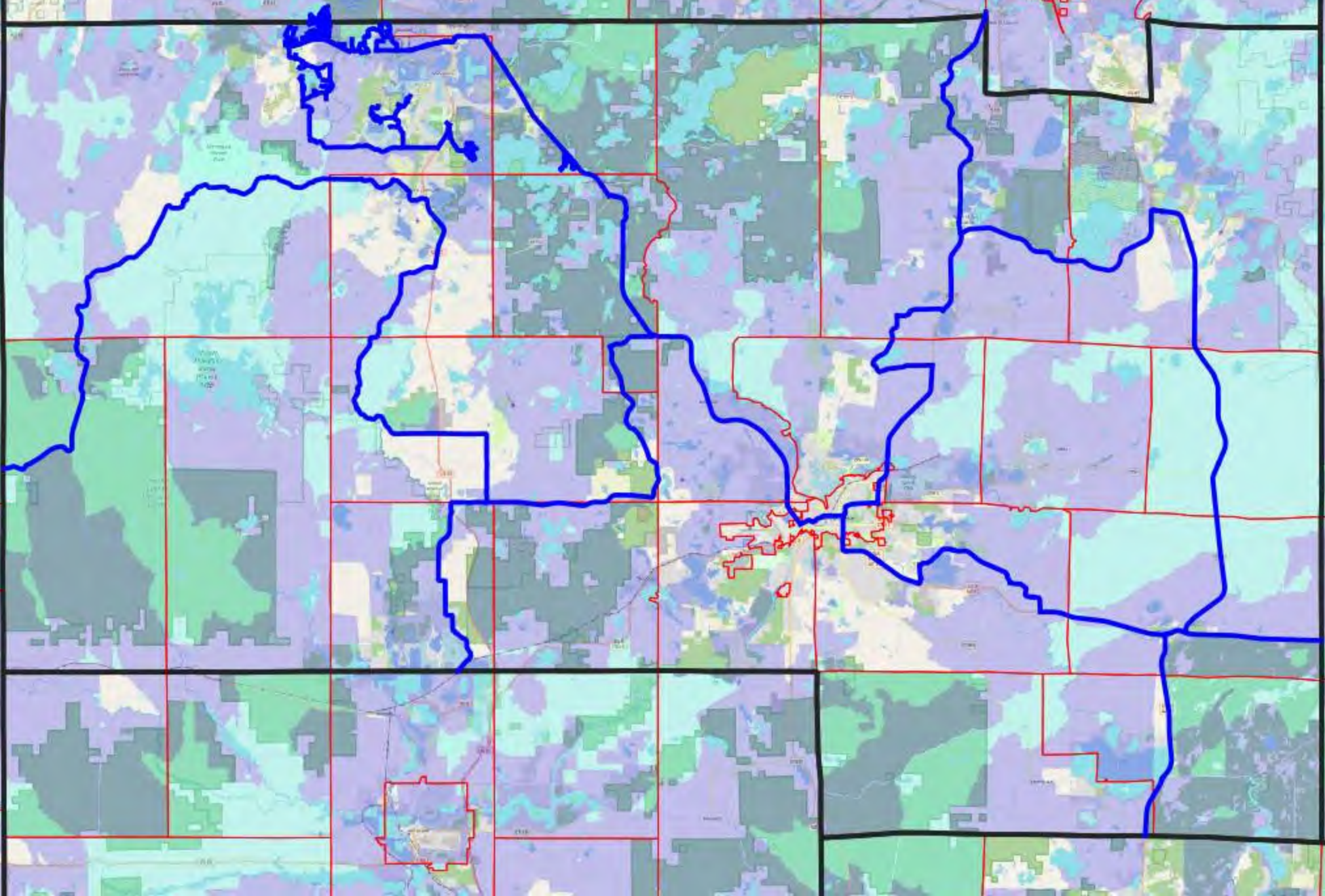
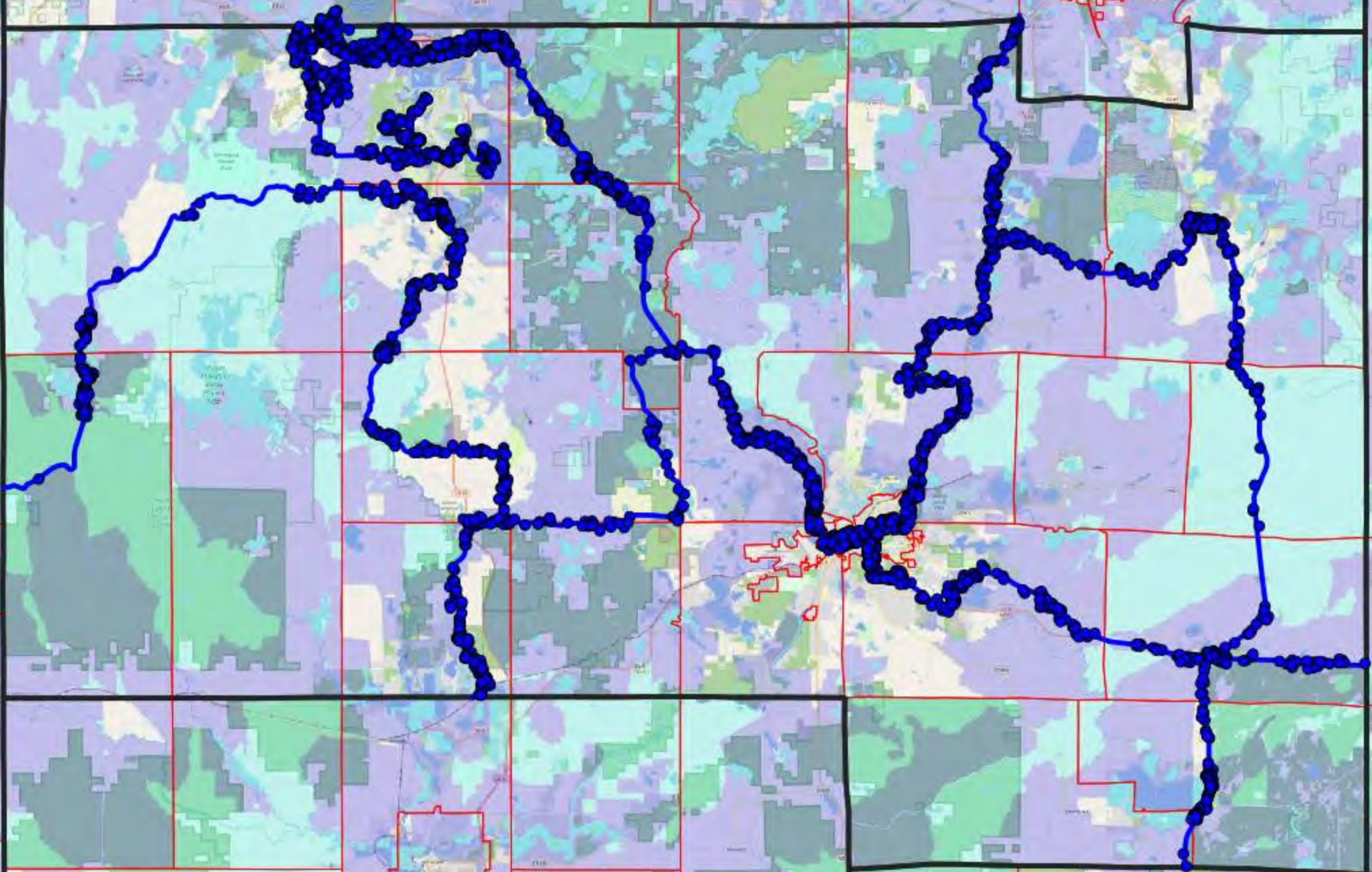


FIGURE 2. PROPOSED DROP LOCATIONS

Hilbert Communications, LLC, is a Wisconsin Limited Liability Company, with its headquarters located at 417 Pine Street, Green Bay, WI 54701, and is an Eligible applicant, as defined by §196.504(1)(ac)(1).

3.2.2 Description of the project

a. A static map and description of the area of the State that will be affected by the proposed project.

Please see the enclosed project maps, located on pages 5 and 6. The enclosed maps show the proposed middle-mile route throughout Oneida County, along which fiber to the home will be deployed, but the impact will be well beyond the route as shown. Future expansion projects, utilizing the middle-mile, will reach beyond the original territory served in this phase of deployment. With these additional projects, all of Oneida County will be affected by this project.

As shown in **Figures 1 and 2** above, there is a significant need for expanded broadband access in Oneida County. Outside of the largest population centers, Rhinelander and Minocqua, nearly the entire County is listed by the PSC as unserved or underserved.

Oneida County lacks the infrastructure, specifically a fiber optic middle mile, necessary for expanded FTTP access in the future, including in those census blocks designate as served, albethem few and far between.

c. An explanation of how the proposed project will increase broadband access. Include information about the:

This project will increase broadband access by making last-mile fiber to the premises connections, in addition to installing middle-mile fiber with substantial capacity for expansion.

This project will have the capacity to service the 5,771 households located along the fiber route, in addition to the 304 business. Of those, 3,370 homes and 177 businesses are in underserved and unserved areas.

The fiber to the premises packages available will include a symmetrical 200 mbps download / 200 mbps upload option for \$64.99, in addition to a 1 Gbps download / 1 Gbps upload option for \$99.99.

d. A statement whether the proposed project is targeting the "last mile," "middle mile," or backbone portion of the broadband infrastructure.

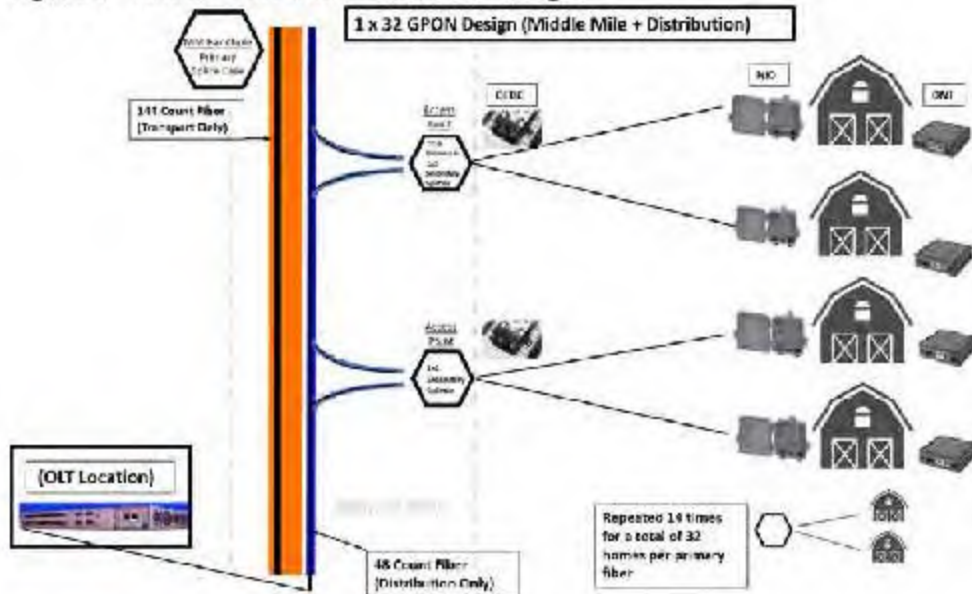
The proposed project will consist of both middle-mile and last-mile assets. The proposed project area is in significant need of additional backbone infrastructure and capacity, with last-mile connections being made along that route to promote a "dig-once" construction model.

e. A description of the broadband service to be provided, including estimated download and upload speeds, whether the speed is based on dedicated or shared bandwidth, and the technology that will be used. This description may be illustrated by a map or schematic diagram, as appropriate.

The network will consist of fiber optic cable connected to GPON/ONT electronics that will provide capacity for over 1 Gbps to each residence and business along the fiber route along with Dense Wave Division Multiplexing (DWDM) equipment for traffic aggregation, capable of supporting 200 to 800 Gbps.

As shown in Figure 3 below, a 144 strand transport fiber will be buried alongside a separate 48 strand fiber that will be utilized for fiber to the premises.

f. For middle mile projects:

At this time, no additional last-mile connections can be disclosed publicly. That said, Northwoods with itself be making last mile connections utilizing the middle-mile for transport.

Connections incident to this grant application will be made within the two-year construction window contemplated for this project, and additional last-mile projects will be completed, by both Northwoods and other internet service providers, in the years that follow.

By making the last-mile connections along the middle-mile route simultaneous to the installation of the middle-mile, it will not be necessary to perform additional construction projects along the same route. This conforms to the “dig-once” construction model, saving both time and construction expense.

- g. A schedule by which the applicant intends to complete the components of the proposed project. The project period is up to 24 months.**

Final route design, in conjunction with Northwoods's partner, and engineering will commence immediately following the announcement of the grant award. This process will last through the end of 2022, with construction beginning in early 2023. Construction of the main-line fiber is anticipated to be completed in June, 2023, with last-mile drops and installations beginning shortly thereafter. It is Northwoods's expectation that the project will be completed by June, 2024.

3.2.3 Itemized Budget (all amounts should be rounded to the nearest dollar)

At this time, Northwoods does not intend to purchase any equipment to facilitate construction pursuant to this grant application. All assets installed incident to this project will be owned and operated by Northwoods, or a related entity.

- b. The application must show that the grant, if awarded, will not subsidize the expenses of a telecommunications provider or the monthly bills of telecommunications customers. The sole purpose of the grant contemplated herein is to facilitate the construction of fiber assets. The grant, if awarded, will not subsidize the expenses of Northwoods, nor will it be used to subsidize the costs paid by customers.

Other than the work done in formulation of this grant application, no planning, engineering, permitting, or construction has taken place. All of the costs of this project, as identified on the enclosed budget, will be incurred during the performance period.

3.2.4 Priority factors supporting the application

As discussed in Section b below, through the R.O.A.D. to Digital Equality Program, and additional funding sources, Northwoods and its partners are pledging a total of \$11,078,000, or 80% of the total project cost.

b. Public-private partnerships. If the public-private partnership is memorialized in a joint venture agreement or other writing, provide a copy of that agreement. To fund this project, Northwoods is utilizing a conduit bond issuance called the Rural Open Access Design (R.O.A.D.) to Digital Equality. In this public private partnership, the County’s contribution to the project will take the form of an underlying guaranty on the bond issuance, and Northwoods will be responsible for all payments and costs associated with the project. Northwoods will own and operate all assets, and the County will benefit through free use of the fiber for governmental purposes for the lifetime of the bonds in addition to other financial considerations.

The creation of the public private partnership between Hilbert Communications and Oneida County is memorialized by Resolution #34-2022 (attached as **Exhibit A**).

Moreover, by Resolution #35-2022, Oneida County is contributing \$1,500,000 outside of the bond issuance, which further demonstrates their commitment to this project (attached as **Exhibit B**).

Additional contributions made by partnering municipalities, as identified on the Budget and Income Summary, are validated in **Exhibits D through K** below.

c. Existing broadband service. A list of the broadband service providers, if any, currently serving the area the applicant proposes to serve. In scoring this element, the following factors will be taken into account:

The design of the project contemplated herein has given significant priority to areas avoided by existing internet service providers. Although the middle-mile route passes through areas with existing service, this is a necessary step to develop a reliable broadband network through the project area.

As shown on Table 1 below, several providers have some level of coverage in the project area. This coverage, however, is rarely, if ever, capable of reliably providing broadband service at speeds of 25 mbps download / 3 mbps upload. The services currently offered in the project area do not meet the needs of the residences and businesses in the project area, which is our sole motivator in undertaking this project.

Insofar as the middle-mile portion of this project is concerned, installation of the middle-mile pursuant to this project will substantially limit future construction costs related to additional last-mile projects. County governments, municipalities, commercial organizations, and economic development advocates have all identified the need for expanded middle-mile transport to meet current needs, anticipate future needs, and to promote economic development.

The design of the middle-mile route was done in cooperation with Oneida County, wherein County officials were able to provide first-hand knowledge of existing broadband assets. This information was utilized to avoid existing areas with adequate coverage if at all possible, while still accomplishing County objectives and allowing for the development of a robust middle-mile capable of serving all of the communities throughout Oneida County.

d. Project impact. A description of the geographic area and the population, both in terms of absolute numbers and likely users, which will be served by the proposed project. Indicate the number of anticipated residential and business customers in the project area, if known. Explain the speed and quality of internet service that will be available. This project will have a profound impact on broadband access in Oneida County. Of the 6,075 homes and businesses that will be able to immediately take service off the middle-mile fiber route, 3,547 are outside of metropolitan areas where broadband service is severely lacking, both in terms of access and affordability.

All last-mile connections made incident to this project will be fiber to the premises. Packages available will include a symmetrical 200 mbps download / 200 mbps upload option for \$64.99, in addition to a 1 Gbps download / 1 Gbps upload option for \$99.99. Northwoods is an Affordable Connectivity Program participant, with dedicated staff available for assistance, meaning support and connectivity for low-income residents is readily achievable.

This expanded access will enable improvements in the lives of the residents of Oneida County by enabling remote work opportunities, improving access to educational opportunities, and enhancing access to medical services and information.

e. Scalability. A description of how the proposed project could expand or improve the broadband service it delivers, while maintaining the quality of its broadband service. This description should include specific projected increases in the following parameters that are known at the time of the application:

Hilbert Communications is undertaking a significant fiber-optic build out across Wisconsin, with proposed projects in more than 45 of the 72 counties. When completed, this will create a statewide, rural focused fiber optic network with as many as 60 redundancies between the end user and the destination of their data traffic.

For too long, networks have been designed on an ad hoc basis, connecting only those areas with significant enough population to allow for a quick return on investment. This has resulted in unreliable networks that travers through entire communities without making connections to the residents. Hilbert Communications has designed networks that focus first on reliability and need, and has found that profitably follows closely when you put the community, and its residents, first.

The project contemplated herein, as part of the statewide network design, will have the capacity to serve significantly more than the 6075 homes and businesses first able to take service. There will be 10 network aggregation points along the middle-mile, allowing future projects to expand in every direction with the capacity to provide service for the totality of Oneida County, and beyond.

Northwoods is installing a 144 strand transport fiber as its middle-mile. Of those 144, 24 have been given to Oneida County through the public private partnership. Of the remaining 120 fibers, 48 fibers will be used for transport related FTTP, fixed wireless broadband, and cellular traffic, leaving 72 fibers, or one half of the installed assets, of additional capacity for future growth and expansion.

This project is about open-access expansion. In addition to compromising their reliability for the sake of profits, ad hoc networks that focus on dense, isolated population areas have a detrimental effect on future development.

Northwoods's middle-mile/last-mile fiber will allow immediate access to those along the route, and it was designed not with dense population areas as the prime motivator. This will facilitate further development, by Northwoods and other competing broadband service providers, by greatly reducing the cost to serve even the most remote customers.

3.2.5 Other information supporting the application

- a. A description of applicant's history or experience constructing broadband communications facilities in the State and elsewhere.**

As a growth oriented company with a statewide footprint, Hilbert Communications, and its subsidiaries, have a long history of undertaking projects of this magnitude.

Through the PSC, Hilbert Communications, and its subsidiaries, have been awarded a number of grants, as shown on Table 2 below. All projects have been completed, or are in the process of being completed, within the parameters outlined in each respective grant application:

Hilbert Communications completed a number of American Rescue Plan Act Broadband Access Grant applications that were not awarded, and four of those projects will commence irrespective of the grant award. Construction on fiber-optic networks in Marathon, Waushara, Calumet, and Fond du Lac Counties will begin this spring.

- b. A description of how the proposed project will or will not duplicate existing broadband infrastructure.**

The project area is one where legacy providers have not continued to make the investments necessary to support modern technological advancement. As discussed above, existing access exists only in areas where profitability facilitated the investment, which leaves large geographic tracts throughout Oneida County with little to no broadband access.

This necessitates the installation of a middle-mile, from which future expansions efforts can grow. The existing middle-mile infrastructure, in addition to being sparse, was not installed to facilitate widespread FTTP. The middle-mile contemplated here reaches far into the corners of the county, enabling low cost projects to make last mile connections.

c. A description of an applicant's financial ability to undertake the proposed broadband construction project. Bug Tussel Wireless was founded in 2003, and in 2008 joined forces with McKinley Reserve and Paul Gehl to form Hilbert Communications through a merger of seven companies. With the goal to remedy the dire need for broadband and cellular access of those living in rural communities, Hilbert Communications has grown substantially in its nearly 20 year history.

The core investment group has made investments in rural wireless and broadband in excess of \$30 million and is currently completing a series of financing agreements to fund over \$500,000,000 of new capital projects through a number of joint ventures with private equity firms and public bond issuances. Consolidated revenues per Hilbert's most recent audited financial statements is nearly \$65,000,000, a doubling year on year increase.

Hilbert Communications, and its subsidiaries,

has a proven track record of operating, maintaining, and continually investing in its network to provide its thousands of rural customers with the best technologies on the market. Collaborating with partners like AT&T, Hilbert Communications currently operates approximately 600 broadband and cellular sites throughout rural Wisconsin, Michigan and Iowa. Further, Hilbert Communications has a rapidly expanding fiber footprint with existing fiber assets in Forest and Oconto Counties, as well as ongoing projects in Iowa, Green, Kewaunee, Marathon, Forest, Fond du Lac, Calumet, and Waushara Counties all set to be completed in 2022.

Hilbert Communications and its subsidiaries can provide turnkey solutions for nearly any rural community. From site acquisition, tower construction, network operations, and sales and service, Hilbert Communications can connect rural communities and keep residents competitive with larger urban centers.

Hilbert Communications has been very deliberate in its network design creating significant redundancies through the use of “ring design” and a combination of over the air and fiberoptic connectivity resulting in industry high performance standards. This design and reputation resulted in the award of construction and operational contracts with AT&T for a portion of the FirstNet® National Emergency Communications Network. Hilbert Communications brings the same reliability and redundancy design to an individual customer in rural Wisconsin as it does to a national emergency communications network.

Hilbert Communications also believes that networks need to be sustainable and as such cannot be reliant on future grants or funding but must seek creative ways in rural markets to leverage assets. This application and our entire network leverages assets and relationships to create a superior network. Hilbert Communications is in the final stages of a national build agreement with AT&T, with nearly 350 sites completed across Wisconsin and southwestern Iowa that also provides a basis for our broadband network and makes broadband possible on AT&T’s network. Since 2018, Hilbert Communications has ramped its site acquisition and construction teams from 2 to 4 sites per month to up to 20 sites per month and has completed nearly 200 sites in a single year. These sites met the stringent quality standards of FirstNet and of AT&T. They also met our own stringent quality standards for each rural customer.

- d. For middle mile projects, state the terms under which the applicant will make its middle mile fiber resource available to last mile providers. Without disclosing project-specific or customer-specific negotiated rates for service or access, state whether access to the middle mile fiber resource will be offered to last mile providers at a rate that is reasonable and common to the industry. Describe any restrictions or limits that may limit the availability or interconnection with the middle mile route.**

Northwood’s network is open to all providers, and we believe that by strategically placing the fiber in unserved or underserved areas and opening the DWDM network to other providers, that the speed of deployment for other providers who may want to use our fiber for backhaul, temporarily or permanently until their construction plans catch up, will be positively impacted.

The rates Northwoods intends to charge will be reasonable, and will include shorter-term lease agreements, longer-term IRUs, and fiber swap agreements. By including 10 access points throughout the middle-mile route, the capacity available for expansion will be easily accessible to any and all who may have an interest.

- e. For middle mile routes, state the amount of fiber capacity, by number of fiber strands in a cable, that the applicant has been reserved for public use. Describe any commitment or tentative discussion indicating the local government or State agency that might use those fiber strands, and for what purpose. Describe any restrictions or limits that may limit the public use (e.g. a possible use conflicts with an existing program covering the same subject matter).**

Through Northwoods’s public private partnership with Oneida County, 24 dark fiber strands are reserved for the County at no cost. This commitment to free access for Oneida County is contracted for 30 years.

Moreover, Northwoods engaged with Oneida County in the planning stages of this grant application to design a network that accomplishes numerous County objectives, better allowing the County to utilize the fiber they are given.

f. A description of how the proposed project will affect the ability of individuals to access health care service from home, including any impact upon the costs of those services.

National studies provide evidence of cost savings with the use of telehealth services. In a pre-COVID-19 study of 40,000 Cigna beneficiaries, the 20,000 beneficiaries who used the MDLive telehealth platform had 17% lower costs when compared with non-virtual care. Virtual care users also experienced a 36% net reduction in ED use per 1,000 people compared to non-virtual care users (Healthcare IT News). The National Committee for Quality Assurance (NCQA) Report of the Taskforce on Telehealth Policy discusses a variety of evidence that the use of telehealth services lowers the overall cost of care. We are confident that this national data can be extrapolated to this project area. Considering that in-person health care services are 20 or more miles away for many residents Oneida County, use of telehealth also results in savings related to travel and time away from work or school.

g. A description of how the proposed project will affect the ability of students to access educational opportunities from home.

There are many online educational programs currently available for students of all ages in the project area. Several school districts have on-line learning labs, where a student can be physically located in their high school but take a class for college credit. While K-12 schools have largely returned to in-person instruction, some families prefer an on-line option. With improved internet access, families in the project area may wish to open-enroll in accredited online schools such as Acellus Academy, Virtual Charter Schools, or the Wisconsin Connections Academy..

Adult professional continuing education has made a major shift to online course delivery, and will be aided by this project. Rural health care providers at all levels, from nursing assistants to sub-specialty physicians, REALTORS, HVAC technicians, accountants, firefighters, childcare providers and others need access to highspeed internet for continuing education to maintain credentials and improve skills.

h. A description of actions taken by a city, village, town, or county in support of the grant application that have not been discussed in the context of a public-private partnership above, including but not limited to:

This project is the result of a true partnership between Northwoods and Oneida County. From planning and design forward, Northwoods and the County have been engaged, and will continue to be engaged to complete the shared goal of expanded broadband access throughout Oneida County.

Moreover, Hilbert Coimmuncations will continue to partner with Oneida County following the completion of the construction project. Northwoods works diligently to level the playing field so that rural areas can utilize the same types of services as urbanized areas and therefore able to fully compete economically and socially to attract and retain residents and businesses. Through its community outreach component, Bug Tussel University, Northwoods will work with Oneida County to provide educational seminars ranging from basic classes (“How to use the internet” and “How to use social media”) to more advanced curriculum. Bug Tussel University personnel are always very engaged in the communities in which Hilbert Communications, and its subsidiaries, operate, seeking user feedback on ways to assist them in connecting technology and the community.

WHEREAS, Oneida County receives funds through CLFRF to assist the County in responding to the public health emergency or its negative economic impacts; to provide premium pay to eligible workers; to make necessary investments in infrastructure; and/or to provide government services; and

WHEREAS, the County established the Funding Opportunities Committee (FOC) to provide direction and guidance on the use of the CLFRF; and

Re: Economic Impact of Improving Broadband in Rural Oneida County per PSC Grant Talking Points – In Support of Bug Tussel's Oneida County Middle Mile/Final Mile Infrastructure Project

Dear Ms. Coker,

Per your application guidelines regarding Economic Development and Economic Impact:

-
- **A discussion of potential economic impact the project could have for an individual business located in the project area:** *Access to rural broadband would dramatically increase economic activity in Oneida County by providing broadband access to seasonal and recreational housing units. There are 13,904 seasonal or recreational housing units in Oneida County (44.8% of all housing units) per a University of Wisconsin Extension study. Of those, through another University of Wisconsin Extension survey, 52.9% did not have acceptable internet access. Through further research, it is estimated that non-residents using seasonal or recreational homes would spend an additional 37 days per year in Oneida County. Each extra day results in \$67 in additional local spend (food, entertainment, etc.). Rolled up this would be an economic activity increase in Oneida County of \$18,200,000 per year if all could be connected. This activity would benefit MANY businesses in Oneida County.*
 - **An explanation of how an improved download and upload transmission speed could better support a specific business in the project area:** *As an economic Development Corporation, we have been forced to limit our searches for property for new businesses to the Rhinelander area to assure access to acceptable broadband speeds. Rural communities and properties are left out due to either no broadband access, or very slow speeds (less than 25/3 service). Improved speeds county wide would open up much more of Oneida County for business.*
 - **An explanation of the likely impact improved broadband service could have on residential property values, supported by local sales data if available:** *Anecdotal, but*



real estate professionals in our area we have talked to value internet access at a minimum of \$10,000 in home value. Often potential buyers will not consider a home without good internet access – it is a very big deal in the rural Oneida County real estate market.

- **A demonstration of how improved broadband service to a residential portion of the project could benefit a telecommuting population:** *Working from home is becoming a permanent way of life post pandemic. Improved transmission speeds will be critical to support this effort and get people back into the workforce. I am unable to work from home reliably due to the lack of rural access to plus 25/3 service (I only have access to fixed wireless service at my home, generally less than 15mbs). Oneida County Economic Development Corporation estimates there more than 500 work from home potential employees in Oneida County unable to take advantage of the work from home business model. Often these are women who cannot find childcare and are forced to stay home with their children. We also get many calls from seasonal residents who would move their businesses or home offices to Oneida County if they had access to acceptable broadband access.*
 - **A demonstration of how the speeds and service being offered by the project fits with current and future economic needs of the community and local businesses:** *The proposed project provides 225 miles of middle mile fiber plus significant final mile hookups for rural customers throughout Oneida County. Fiber would guarantee acceptable speeds now (at least 100mbs) and would increase as technology improves.*
 - **How the proposed project will affect the ability of individuals to access health care service from home, including any impact upon the costs of those services.** *Telemedicine is becoming the norm in rural areas of Wisconsin, augmented by Zoom and other video conference platforms. High speed access to the internet is essential. A single Office visit costs upwards of \$150, whereas a telemedicine visit is \$45 or less (Teledoc) and is generally covered without deductible by insurance.*
 - **How the proposed project will affect the ability of students to access educational opportunities from home:** *Broadband access to students is critical in rural areas, creating a tremendous disadvantage compared to non-rural areas. This is especially acute in the Three Lakes and Lakeland school districts. Those who can get internet access are typically slower than 25mbs, taking an average of 22 seconds for a single web page to load. In Rhinelander where 100mps fiber service is available, that same web page takes only 7 seconds to load. Many parents are forced to take their children to public establishments that have free wi-fi to complete their homework.*

- Additional Subject/Comment from WXPR (Wisconsin Public Radio):

"The way we consume news has changed. People are looking for digital options to receive their news and entertainment. This has created an environment where daily newspapers have disappeared, and television and radio news departments have closed or realigned their focus. This has created a "news desert" for many rural areas. A healthy democratic society depends on a well-informed public, especially at the local level. This loss of local media can be observed at the local level in Oneida County.

The economic impact of the pandemic has also driven the rapid adoption of digital technologies and is prompting change in news operations. WXPR Public Radio, along with 80 other public media outlets, has pledged to carry out a digital transformation plan, guided by the Corporation for Public Broadcasting.

This new normal has created a unique opportunity for WXPR to adapt and reinvent ourselves as a digital leader in news and public safety information, at a time when the area is in need of these services.

Reliable broadband technology will revolutionize the way news services and information are provided to the citizens of Oneida County, ensuring our public has access to the information it needs, from trusted news sources."
