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<u>Flu:</u> McMillion reviewed flu hospitalizations and stated numbers have not changed from the previous month. McMillion reviewed the flu administration volume provided by the health department, which shows an increase for flu vaccines the health department has given each flu season.

<u>Coronavirus (COVID-19) – Data / Vaccine:</u> McMillion reviewed COVID-19 data dashboard. Discussion followed.

<u>Coronavirus (COVID-19) - Schools:</u> Conlon said they continue to meet with schools on a weekly basis. Schools are utilizing the CDC recommendations. Rhinelander and Three Lakes schools districts are providing COVID-19 testing to students, staff and families of students.

Coronavirus (COVID-19) – Community Testing: Conlon put in a request to have testing extended through the end of February. The testing extension was approved and the National Guard will only be testing on Tuesdays in February. Conlon mentioned the health department is continuing to test one day a week at the department because there was an increased need in the community. Conlon is also looking into the option to have an outside company come into the community to continue to do testing on Tuesdays when the Guard is done and to also add Saturdays.

Coronavirus (COVID-19) – Funding: Conlon said funding is still available for use.
