<u>Vice Chair Hess called the meeting to order at 1:00 p.m. in accordance with the Wisconsin Open Meetings Law.</u>

Discussion/decision concerning Ordinance Amendment #06-2025 authored by the Town of Three Lakes and District #13 Supervisor Collette Sorgel, agent, to amend Chapter 9, Article 5, Section 9.58 Tourist Rooming House of the Oneida County Zoning and Shoreland Protection Ordinance. The committee will be reviewing a Resolution to forward to the County Board. Motion by Billy Fried, second by Bob Almekinder, to table Ordinance Amendment #06-2025 indefinitely. The members present voted as follows:

<u>Discussion/Decision regarding Tourist Rooming House fees. The committee will also be discussing all aspects of Section 9.58 Tourist Rooming House of the Oneida County Zoning and Shoreland Protection Ordinance.</u> Mr. Jennrich discussed the details of the matter. Mr. Jennrich reached out to the WCCA to find out what counties administer a tourist rooming house ordinance through their zoning ordinance, if they charge administrative review fees, and if they have a renewal

fee. Mr. Jennrich discussed the details of his findings through the responses of other counties, as well as the information and background of Oneida County Planning and Zoning Department's process. The committee conferred with Mr. Jennrich and Mr. Troskey regarding retroactive implementation for annual renewal and the fees for initial applications and renewal applications.

Motion by Bob Almekinder, second by Dan Hess, to (increase) the initial (tourist rooming house administrative review permit application) fees to five hundred (\$500.00) and (increase) the renewal (tourist rooming house renewal application) fees to five hundred (\$500.00). With all members present voting "Aye," the motion carried.

Discussion/decision concerning boathouse doors for property described as Lot 1, CSM 1335, and being part of Government Lot 2, Section 29, T39N, R11E, PIN TL-1267-6A, Town of Three Lakes. The committee will be discussing possible violations. Mr. Jennrich discussed the details of the matter. Mr. Troskey further discussed the details. The committee reviewed and discussed the onsite inspection photos and the permit application. The committee conferred with Mr. Jennrich and Mr. Troskey. Staff will bring the matter back at a future meeting to discuss with Corporation Counsel. Discussion only, no action taken.

With all members present voting "Aye," the motion carried.</u>

<u>Penalty Provisions of the Oneida County General Code. The committee will be reviewing forfeiture amounts for all violations of ordinances administered by the Planning and Zoning Department.</u> Mr. Jennrich discussed the details and background of the matter. The committee conferred with Mr. Jennrich. <u>Motion by Bob Almekinder, second by Dan Hess, to accept #10 as presented.</u> With all members present voting "Aye," the motion carried.

<u>Penalty Provisions of the Oneida County General Code. The committee will be reviewing a resolution to forward to the Oneida County Board of Supervisors.</u> Mr. Jennrich discussed the details of the matter. <u>Motion by Bob Almekinder, second by Dan Hess, to approve the resolution and send to the County Board. With all members present voting "Aye," the motion carried.</u>
