1. Call to Order:

The regular meeting of the Criminal Justice Coordinating Committee (CJCC) was brought to order at 12:03 p.m. by Mr. Steven Schreier, Chairperson. The Chairperson noted that the meeting had been properly posted and mailed in accordance with the Wisconsin Open Meeting Laws.

2. Approval of Agenda:

Motion by Mr. Tyler Young, seconded by Ms. Mary Sowinski to approve the agenda as posted. All ayes; motion carried.

3. Review of Minutes from January 11, 2024 CJCC Meeting:

Motion by Ms. Mary Rideout, seconded by Mr. Steven Schreier to approved the January 11, 2024 minutes as presented. All ayes; motion carried.

4. Presentation Drug Endangered Children (DEC) and should we integrate into the CJCC:

Ms. Beth Hoerchler presented the Historical Drug Endangered Children (DEC) referrals as well as shared the Drug Endangered Child definition. She also explained the purpose of the DEC Team as well as the partners of the team. The DEC committee feels at this time the CJCC should consider integrating the DEC committee into the CJCC. The DEC committee would meet twice a year and could be asked to meet additionally if issues arise around cooperation of partners on investigating and prosecuting DEC cases (debriefing), opportunities to train or inform each other on changes to policy or procedure around investigations of DEC cases or training to be offered collaboratively to the public on issues surrounding

DEC cases. Motion by Mr. Steven Schreier for the DEC Committee to be a sub-committee of the CJCC, seconded by Mr. Tyler Young. All ayes; motion carried.

5. **Allowable Uses of Opioid Settlement Funds:**

The committee was provided with information on how Opioid Settlement funds can be used. There are a number of different settlements, with different requirements. Ms. Mary Rideout and Ms. Heidi Chavez will find out which ones we are receiving. It is hard to target Opioid use since some started with Opioid's and then moved on to another drug or have multiple. It is hoped that these settlements have flexibility with what substance is being used at this time.

6. **Sub-Committee Updates:**

a. Diversion Sub-Committee:

Items Complete:

- First participants moved/moving into Phase 2.
- Five participants calling in to drug testing line; random drug testing.
- Defined testing/case management frequency to accommodate TAD Grant, EBPs and risk levels.
- With initial observations of program and area resources, the sub-committee decided to accept only low and moderate risk individuals; a future treatment court and increased services would better serve high risk individuals.
- Team Meeting/JusticePoint All Staff- Employee Resource Group.
- Coordinator spoke with Law Enforcement at the January 11 Chief's Meeting.
- Quarter Four and Final 2023 Grant Reports were submitted.
- Directors and Coordinator met with the APPR project to learn more about the PSA tool and Pre-Trial Service.

- b. OWI Court Sub-Committee: The group is working on updating the Handbook and Procurement Plan which needs to go to the Department of Corrections which will start the Grant Process. A budget will need to be developed. OWI will be contracting with Koller for OWI Court.
 - c. Funding Sub-Committee: ARPA funds need to be spent by the end of 2024 or contractually obligated. Approximately \$90,000 was pulled back by the county so it doesn't have to get sent back to the federal government. Working on how to spend ARPA and Opioid dollars. We are developing a plan, a future state, regarding the goals to be reached by 2030 (Attachment reviewed by committee). If anyone has any thoughts on the future state and want things added or changed let anyone on the sub-committee know.
7. **Attendance at Wisconsin Association of Treatment Court Professionals conference, April 24-26.**
It was recommended that members of the CJCC attend this conference. We would want a group to attend. If people are interested in attending to represent the CJCC let Ms. Mary Rideout know. The Public Defender's office is sending two people. JusticePoint will possibly have the two case managers and Ms. Tricia Moore in attendance. It would be nice to have someone from the DA office and LE.
8. **Membership Updates – Substance Use Disorder Provider, County Board Representative and Department of Corrections:**
Mr. Russ Fisher was appointed to the CJCC to replace Mr. Tom Kelly as a County Board Representative. The Department of Corrections has Ms. Lindsey Flynn as a replacement. The Veterans Department also had some staff changes. Request to add Kari Decorah as the Substance Use Disorder Representative. Motion by Ms. Mary Sowinski to approve Kari Decorah as a non-voting member of the CJCC, seconded by Mr. Tyler Young. All ayes; motion carried.
9. **Partner Updates:**
Nothing to report at this time.
10. **Budget, Data and Program Reports:**
The group reviewed the TAD Grant Funding report as of December 31, 2023. The Committee also reviewed the data and thought it may be beneficial to track by township and income level. Ms. Tricia Moore will explore if we can track by income level.

11. **Public Comment:**

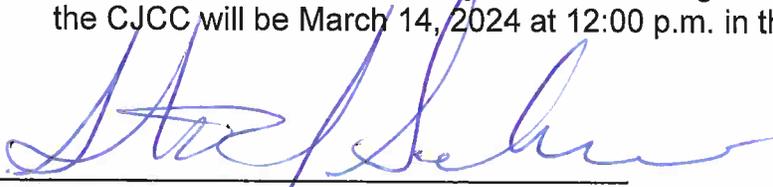
