<u>National Guard Presentation</u>: National Guard Members expressed their gratitude and presented honey badger service coin to the Oneida County Health Department in honor of serving their community. Kelly accepted the coin in Conlon's name and on her behalf.

DNR contract: Oneida County Health Department (OCHD) renews a contract with the DNR every year for the water program. Troskey explained OCHD is an agent for the DNR doing the water sampling, investigating and surveys in Oneida County. OCHD sends the results back to the DNR. Troskey mentioned Wiensch from Corporation Counsel reviewed the contract and made suggested changes. These suggested changes were sent to the state and have been documented. Conlon explained the state sends the same contract to all of the counties but does not make any changes. Discussion followed. Motion by Schreier/Fried to accept the contract as is. All ayes; motion carried.

<u>Coronavirus (COVID-19) - Data:</u> McMillion reviewed COVID-19 dashboard. McMillion mentioned at this time Oneida County's activity level is in the high range and is going down. Seventy percent of the adults age 65 and older are vaccinated. The health department is finishing up vaccinating the educators and daycare and then will open up to higher education. Discussion followed.

<u>Coronavirus (COVID-19) - Schools:</u> Conlon stated the health department continues to meet on a weekly basis with the schools. Conlon mentioned that by the end of March, all the educators should have received a first dose of the COVID-19 vaccine. Fried suggested positive reinforcement education when we get to different groups because there is some misconception of the purpose of the vaccine. Discussion followed.

<u>Coronavirus (COVID-19) – Community Testing:</u> Conlon stated Oneida County did get approval to have testing continue until May 25. McMillon stated there is a statewide

task force regarding sustainability of testing in the state. The task force is trying to come up with some sort of model or process to keep this resource available. Discussion followed.

<u>Coronavirus (COVID-19) – Vaccine Update</u>: Conlon said there was nothing new to report as vaccines were discussed when reviewing the COVID-19 dashboard.
