10 WHEREAS, in order to provide the coordinated leadership necessary to
11 establish and foster innovative, effective criminal justice programs for adult and juvenile
12 offenders in Oneida County and to qualify for future state and federal grants that fund
13 such programs, an Oneida County Criminal Justice Coordinating Committee (CJCC) has
14 been established; and

15 WHEREAS, the Oneida County Fair Subcommittee has been dissolved, and
16 WHEREAS, Oneida County Code shall reflect the addition of the Criminal
17 Justice Coordinating Committee.

18 NOW, THEREFORE, THE ONEIDA COUNTY BOARD OF SUPERVISORS
19 DOES ORDAIN AS FOLLOWS:

20 Section 1. Any existing ordinances, codes, resolutions, or portions thereof in
21 conflict with this ordinance shall be and hereby are repealed as far as any conflict exists.

22 Section 2. This ordinance shall take effect the day after passage and publication
23 as required by law.

24 Section 3. If any claims, provisions or portions of this ordinance are adjudged
25 unconstitutional or invalid by a court of competent jurisdiction, the remainder of this
26 ordinance shall not be affected thereby.

27 Section 4. Sections 2.48 and 2.50 of the General Code of Oneida County,

68 (a) The Criminal Justice Coordinating Committee (CJCC) shall consist of 13 voting
69 members:

- 70 1. Oneida County Branch I Judge
- 71 2. Oneida County Branch II Judge
- 72 3. District Attorney
- 73 4. Oneida County Sheriff
- 74 5. A representative of Chiefs of Police from Local Municipalities
- 75 6. State Public Defender – Oneida County
- 76 7. Department of Corrections Supervisor for Oneida County
- 77 8. Corporation Counsel
- 78 9. Social Services Department Director
- 79 10. The Human Service Center Director
- 80 11. Health Department Director
- 81 12. County Board Representative
- 82 13. County Board Representative

83 (b) Invited Community Liaisons, without voting privileges, and who will not be
84 considered for the purposes of determining a quorum may include the following as
85 determined by the CJCC:

- 86 1. Clerk of Court
- 87 2. Domestic Violence Professional
- 88 3. Private Defense Attorney
- 89 4. School District Representative
- 90 5. Social Services, Juvenile Justice Supervisor
- 91 6. Social Services, Child Support Supervisor
- 92 7. Representative for higher education
- 93 8. Ministry representative
- 94 9. Medical Examiner
- 95 10. Tribal Representative
- 96 11. VA - Veterans Outreach Coordinator

97 (2) Officers The Committee shall elect a Chair and Vice Chair by majority vote of the
98 Committee annually at the Committee's May meeting, or as soon thereafter as practical.

100 (3) Purpose The County Board shall designate the CJCC to review policies and programs
101 within the criminal justice system and makes recommendations to all justice system
102 partners, the Public Safety Committee, the Social Services Committee, other county

103 committees and the Oneida County Board of Supervisors regarding juvenile and criminal
104 justice system issues.

106 (4) The committee of jurisdiction for the CJCC shall be the Public Safety Committee. The
107 CJCC shall submit their annual budget, if any, to the Public Safety Committee for review
108 and approval per the Oneida County budgeting schedule.

110 (5) Citizen members serving on the CJCC will not receive per diem or other compensation
111 from the County.

113 (6) The CJCC will make periodic reports to the Public Safety Committee and the Oneida
114 County Board as determined by those bodies.

119 (1) Composition and Appointment. This Committee shall consist of five members
120 appointed by the County Board Chair.

121 (2) Powers and Duties.

122 (a) Approve the bills and expenses of the Sheriff's Department and offices of District
123 Attorney, Medical Examiner, Clerk of Court, Corporation Counsel, Circuit Court, Family
124 Court Commissioner, Emergency Management and Register in Probate.

125 (b) Assist in the preparation of the annual budget for the Sheriff's Department and offices
126 of District Attorney, Medical Examiner, Clerk of Court, Corporation Counsel and Circuit
127 Court.

128 (c) Make purchases for the Sheriff's Department of other equipment and supplies not
129 under the jurisdiction of the Buildings and Grounds Committee, where County Board
130 approval is not necessary.

131 (d) Perform all duties necessary to carry out the functions of the Committee under
132 Chapters 6 and 12.04 of this General Code.

133 (e) Oversight of Oneida County Ambulance Services.

134 1. The Committee shall negotiate contracts for the provision of County-wide ambulance
135 service pursuant to the provisions of § 11.10 of this Code. If the contracts are breached
136 or private service cannot be continued, the Committee may provide for ambulance service
137 for the County until the next County Board meeting.

138 2. The Committee shall buy and sell ambulance vehicles which shall be insured by the
139 County and which the Committee may make available to the ambulance service provider.

140 3. The Committee shall purchase, install and maintain mobile radio units in the ambulance
141 vehicles.
