Resolution to Return certain Coronavirus Local Fiscal Recovery Funds (CLFRF) back to Oneida County American Rescue Plan Act (ARPA) Contingency account due to United States Treasury (UST) November 2023 Interim Final Rule

Resolution approved for presentation to the Oneida County Board by the Supervisors of the Administration Committee

Resolved by the Board of Supervisors of Oneida County, Wisconsin:

WHEREAS, The American Rescue Plan Act (ARPA) amends Title VI of the Social Security Act by adding Sections 602 and 603 establishing the Coronavirus Local Fiscal Recovery Fund (CLFRF); and

WHEREAS, Oneida County received funds through CLFRF to assist the County in responding to the public health emergency or its negative economic impacts; to provide premium pay to eligible workers; to make necessary investments in infrastructure; and/or to provide government services; and

WHEREAS, certain restrictions of the use of these funds are determined by the United States Treasury (UST) Department including the prohibition of depositing the funds into any pension fund; directly or indirectly offsetting tax revenue; and does limit the amount of CLFRF funding to be used for "government services" to a not-to-exceed revenue reduction cap; and

WHEREAS, UST issued a final ruling in November 2023 which affirmed the deadlines for the commitment of CLFRF funds to be no later than December 31, 2024, and the disbursement of payment of CLFRF funds to be no later than December 31, 2026; and

WHEREAS, UST issued a final ruling in November 2023 to further refine the definition of commitment which specifically excludes local government appropriation, and excludes personnel costs incurring after December 31, 2024, and

WHEREAS, UST issued a final ruling in November 2023 to prohibit the reallocation and / or reprogramming of funding from one project to another after December 31, 2024, and

WHEREAS, Resolution #19-2022 allocated \$211,708 for the purposes of Social Services Children Support Worker; upon further review it has been determined that a maximum of \$164,708 of the funding will be used within the UST deadlines resulting in \$47,000 available for return to ARPA contingency, and

WHEREAS, Resolution #97-2022 allocated \$50,000 for the purposes of Public Health Department delivery of services; upon further review it has been determined that a maximum of \$31,100 of the funding will be used within the UST deadlines resulting in \$18,900 available for return to ARPA contingency, and

WHEREAS, Resolution #108-2022 allocated \$100,000 for the purposes of Broadband engineering and consulting; upon further review it has been determined that a maximum of





Hi Billy, At the January 12, 2024 Capital Improvement meeting, it was decided, based on my estimated expenditures, to reduce our ARPA funds for substance abuse mitigation by \$ 99,000. We have recently received our final bill for 2023 for the Diversion Program (TAD Grant), and it was substantially more than we had anticipated. Because of that, we reevaluated the funds we will need as match in 2024. The TAD grant requires a 25% match, and we have been using both in-kind match (my time) and cash match (ARPA) funds to meet that requirement.

We are therefore requesting that the resolution to "take-back" ARPA funds from resolution 06-2023 be reduced from \$99,000 to \$94,000. This will leave us with sufficient funds to cover the 2023 and 2024 required match for the Treatment Alternative and Diversion (TAD) Grant.

Because this was not done in the form of a motion, we are seeking your approval to change the amount from \$99,000 to \$94,000 before it goes to the administration committee for approval. Please respond to all if you approve.
