

Amended RESOLUTION # 25-2023

Resolution to Object to the State Removing Future Taxable Land by Purchasing Conservation and Access Easements.

Resolved by the Board of Supervisors of Oneida County, Wisconsin:

Whereas, notwithstanding the requirements of the Knowles Nelson Stewardship program, neither the Oneida County Board Chair nor the Oneida County Clerk were notified of the possible purchase of the easements; and,

Whereas, the affected Towns and the two affected Counties were given 30 days to respond with a resolution in support or against the purchase of the easements; and

Whereas, two of the affected Towns delivered to the DNR a resolution opposing the purchase of the easement within the 30 day requirement and to the person the DNR designated to respond to; and

Whereas, ~~no~~ none of the affected Towns and ~~only one~~ none of three affected Counties sent in a resolution in support of the purchase of the easements by the date as set by the DNR in their notice to the affected Towns and Counties; and

Whereas, the DNR never followed up to see if any of the affected Towns or Counties had sent in a resolution in favor of the purchase of the easement or opposing it as outlined in the notice that the DNR sent to the affected Towns and two of the affected Counties; and

Whereas, Oneida County needs answers to questions on how the easement will affect the future tax base, economic impact and the easement agreement; and

Whereas, the low property taxes paid on Managed Forest Lands inadequately compensates local government for the infrastructure and services they provide; and

Be It Resolved, that the Oneida County Board of Supervisors object to the above proposed purchase of conservation and access easements as proposed; and

Be It Further Resolved, that the future time period be extended to 90 days for the affected Towns and Counties to respond with a resolution in favor of the easement purchase or opposing it; and

Be it Further Resolved, that the local SNOWMOBILE/ATV/UTV clubs work with the affected Counties to lay out permanent trails throughout Phase 2 of the Pelican River Forest Easement; and

Be it Further Resolved, that the State purchase a 33' wide SNOWMOBILE/ATV/UTV trail throughout Phase 2 of the Pelican River Forest and deed the easement to the affected Counties; and

Be it Further Resolved, that the State purchase a 66' wide right of way over the proposed woods roads and deed those to the affected Counties within Phase 2 of the proposed easement; and

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Be it Further Resolved, that the DNR gives the affected counties the endowment funds that they proposed to the grantor for road maintenance in the proposed agreement; and

Be it Further Resolved, that Oneida County does not want more public land within their County without County and Town approval if Federal or State funds are used to purchase easements; and

Be it Further Resolved, that the severance taxes on timber sales from Managed Forest Lands, eliminated in a previous budget, be restored to provide the infrastructure needed for harvesting and managing these important lands for our forest industry; and

Be it Further Resolved, that a copy of this Resolution be provided to The Governor, The Secretary of the DNR, all Northern Counties and all State Representatives of the Northern Counties.
